State Chaplain's Summation

Recently our Supreme Chaplain Archbishop Lori commented that every Knight should be a recruiter. A recruiter for what? For the Order? Well, yes but not just that. Each and every Catholic is called to be a recruiter for Jesus.

Before Our Lord ascended into Heaven, He gave His disciples commands, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" Matt 28: 19-20. Before you say, "Well it looks like you priests have a lot of work to do. Get cracking!" realize that this commandment is for the whole Church: lay, religious, and clergy. Yes, we all are called to do it in different ways depending on our state of life, but it is the responsibility of each of us.

Most converts come to the Faith because they have seen a relative, friend, neighbor, or co-worker living the Faith well and have been impressed. You don't have to stand on a corner and preach to spread the Gospel.

We are also called to recruit for vocations. When was the last time you asked an unmarried man whether he has every thought about the priesthood or a brother Knight if he has considered the diaconate? God often calls, but He often calls others through us.

And we recruit not just for 'Church' vocations but also for the vocation of marriage and family life.

By living this vocation well and endeavoring to live it
