Sponsor a Mass for the Unborn.

Just as Catholics come together annually for the March for Life in Washington DC or the West Coast Walk for Life in San Francisco California, standing up for the right to life, Catholics also need to come together at Holy Mass to pray for the unborn. To raise this awareness among the faithful in the diocese, your Knights council can sponsor a Mass for the Unborn. Coordinate this with your priest and bishop and schedule it at a time where Knights councils and others can attend.

A useful resource is the Respect Life Liturgy Guides that are produced yearly by the USCCB and mailed to each parish by the diocese every fall. Contact your parish office, the Family Life Office of the Diocese of Salt Lake City or the USCCB at www.usccb.org/prolife to obtain a copy.

Coordinate the Mass for the Unborn around the anniversary of Roe v Wade (January 22) or during respect life month (October) or during the month of May. May is the month which the piety of the faithful has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady. After the Mass, schedule a reception and use this as an opportunity to educate your parishioners, by displaying fetal models, making pro-life information available and selling precious feet pins, etc...

Sponsor a Pro-Life sign on a busy highway/freeway in your area.

Engage in 40-days for Life.

40 Days for Life is a community-based campaign that draws attention to the evil of abortion through the use of a three-point program: prayer and fasting, constant vigil, and community outreach. Organize a group signup. This is definitely a KNIGHTLY activity - protecting the weak and the vulnerable. The campaign runs this spring (2012), February 22nd through April 1st, 2012.

Sponsor Youth to Attend the West Coast Walk for Life

This is a yearly event in San Francisco, coordinated around the anniversary of Roe v Wade, with the mission to shed light on all issues of life, but particularly to change hearts hurt by the violence of abortion. Create a Pro-Life Monument at your church.

Knights of Columbus units throughout the Order pay tribute to the millions of children killed by abortion by erecting memorials in Catholic cemeteries, on council hall grounds, and at parishes.

The idea for these memorials grew from a challenge made by the late Cardinal John O'Connor in his homily at the opening Mass of the 110th annual Supreme Council Meeting held in New York in 1992. He described the Tomb of the Unborn on the campus of Franciscan University in Steubenville, Ohio, and asked his brother Knights "to continue the Order's aggressive fight against abortion" by erecting a tomb in each Catholic cemetery in each diocese where the Order is established. This request struck a chord with Knights and the program became a grassroots phenomenon. Since the program began more than 1,835 monuments have been built. These monuments, ranging from simple headstones to elaborate memorials, stand as testimony to one simple fact: Human life is a sacred gift from God to be protected and cherished at all stages from conception to natural death.

Councils should work with their local monument companies to determine what style would best suit their needs and resources. These memorials also feature many different messages. Here are some examples:

- "In memory of all innocent victims of abortion."
- "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you," Jeremiah 1:5
- "Rachel mourns her children, she refuses to be consoled because her children are no more."
 Jeremiah 31:15-17.
- "Please pray for an end to abortion."

Support the Crossroads Walkers as they pass through SLC in June

Crossroads was founded in 1995 by Steve Sanborn, a student at Franciscan University of Steubenville (Ohio) as a response to John Paul II's call to the youth of the world to take an active role in the pro-life movement in order to establish a Culture of Life. An integral part of Crossroads is our yearly pro-life pilgrimages across the United States. Each summer, young adults walk on four simultaneous pro-life walks across America from Seattle, San Francisco, San Jose and Los Angeles to Washington, D.C.. Walking over 12,000 miles and through 40 states, these young people hope to convert the hearts and minds of others – at the grass-roots level – by witnessing to the dignity and sanctity of all human life, from the moment of conception to natural death. Crossroads also conducts a pro-life walk across Canada each summer from Vancouver to Ottawa, which takes simultaneously with our other walks.

When the Crossroad Walkers pass through Salt Lake City in June, organize Knights to attend the Saturday events. The events include morning Mass at the Cathedral, a prayer procession (walk) to an abortion clinic, a prayer vigil at the clinic. You may also offer to host walkers at individual Knight's home. Pro Life FUND Raising Ideas for Councils

Baby Bottle Campaign.

The premise of this fund raiser is to hand out baby bottles to your parishioners, requesting the bottles to come back filled with change. The change returned, minus the cost of the bottles is the profit for the fund raiser. Similar to the rice bowls drive during Lent. The fund raiser is executed in 3 easy steps. 1) Plan the drive. 2) Distribute the bottles. 3) Harvest the bottles & count the money! During this fundraiser, take this opportunity to educate your parish on the value of life, the need to protect the unborn and the need to assist new mothers and their babies.

Here are some suggestions on how to conduct a "Knights of Columbus Baby Bottle Campaign":

- Recruit a Knight to chair the project.
- Obtain your pastor's permission to operate the "Knights of Columbus Baby Bottle Campaign" in the parish. Visit your pastor in person (not via a phone or e-mail) to ask permission to conduct the program. You should ask for at least two weekends -- the first to hand out bottles and the second to collect them.
- Determine the number of baby bottles you will need to cover the number of weekend Mass attendees. Ask your pastor for the number of families who donate to the parish each week.
- Ask council members to donate clean used baby bottles.
- If not enough bottles are donated, visit your local discount store and ask to speak with the manager. Explain the number of baby bottles you wish to purchase, which may be more than are currently in stock. Get a commitment to receive them several weeks prior to the event.
- When the bottles arrive, remove the nipples (to ensure that the bottles are used for the
 collection) and put the labels on them. The labels (made possibly from mailing labels available at
 most office supply stores) should include your council's name, wording such as "Knights of
 Columbus Baby Bottle Campaign for Pro-Life Initiatives," the return date, and the Order's
 emblem.
- At an organizational meeting assign Knights to each exit of the church to hand out baby bottles
 on the distribution date. Ask that an announcement be put in the parish bulletin on the
 program. Also place posters around the parish (with the pastor's permission). Run the first
 bulletin notice a week prior to the distribution.
- Ask the pastor to announce the program from the pulpit or have a council officer do it on the day the bottles are handed out.
- On the set date, collect the bottles with the money before or after Mass. For people who forget their bottles, ask them to drop them at the parish office at their convenience (make arrangements with the pastor for this).
- With permission of the organization you are donating to, send a photo and press release on the donation to the local media. Try to avoid a "grip and grin" type presentation photo and instead send a photograph of people at the center sorting the donated items or the items being used.
- Store the bottles safely for use during your next campaign.

Pro-Life Baby Shower

Sponsoring a "Knights of Columbus Pro-life Baby Shower" is a great way to raise funds and obtain supplies for local pro-life organizations, crisis pregnancy centers, and shelters for women and children. Conduct the event at your local parish or community center, asking for donations of used baby or maternity clothing, infant and pregnancy supplies, diapers, bottles, formula, etc.

Here are some steps to follow when conducting this program.

- Recruit a Knight to chair the project
- Ask council members if they have an old crib that is in good condition or a portable play pen that is not being used.
- Obtain your pastor's permission to set up an old crib or play pen in the church's entry way or foyer.
- Set a period of time to run the event (for example, weekends for a month) and ask your parish
 priest or make an announcement about the initiative, or get permission to have a council
 officers make an announcement before or after each Mass. Also, request for a written
 announcement in the parish bulletin. In the announcement ask parishioners to consider
 donating new or used baby or maternity clothing, baby and pregnancy supplies, diapers, bottles,
 formula, etc.
- When collecting monetary donations, make sure to have a secure receptacle in your collection area for cash and checks.
- TIP: Place some nice baby/maternity items and supplies in the collection receptacle after setting
 it up so people can see what types of items are needed. Put a sign on the collection receptacle
 so people who miss the announcement will know what it is for.
- Collect the items after Mass each weekend.
- With permission of the organization you are donating to, send a photo and press release on the donation to the local media. Try to avoid a "grip and grin" type presentation photo and instead send photograph of people at the center sorting the donated items or the items being used.
