Knights of Columbus Founder Father Michael McGivney Moves Closer to Sainthood

CURRENT PHASE OF THE CAUSE

With the joyous news that Pope Francis has approved a miracle through Father McGivney's intercession, the next step in the process will be a beatification Mass, to be held in the fall of 2020 in the Archdiocese of Hartford, Conn. At that time, the founder of the Knights of Columbus will be declared "Blessed" and his feast day will be set. Father McGivney will be the first U.S.-born priest to be beatified who spent his entire priestly ministry in a parish. This is a great boost to the priesthood and to the Catholic Church in America.

We ask you to join us in thanking God for favoring Father McGivney's Cause in this way by spreading the word about the powerful intercession of this holy priest.

Another certified miracle through the intercession of Father McGivney is now needed for him to be considered for canonization and sainthood. A miracle in this context is an extraordinary event that God performs through the intercession of a holy Servant of God. Most miracles that are accepted and approved involve physical healings that are medically inexplicable, so the Guild asks everyone devoted to Father McGivney to pray to him in times of illness and report any favors received. Bryant Sayers married his nurse, Connie, whom he met in the Sierra Vista Hospital. They are the very proud grandparents of three. Bryant was welcomed into the Catholic Church on Christmas day of 2000 at St. Andrew the Apostle Catholic Parish, Sierra Vista Arizona.

He served a distinguished career in the United States Army Military Intelligence Corps, retiring in April of 2000 as a Sergeant First Class.

He served over 38 years of government service and recently retired as a Department of Defense instructor on Fort Huachuca, AZ teaching a satellite communications system to deploying soldiers.

Sir Knight/Brother Bryant became a member of the Knights of Columbus Bishop Salpointe Council 4584 in July of 2001 and joined St Francis of Assisi Assembly 2058 in November of 2002.

Sir Knight/Brother Bryant was elected State Deputy in 2012 after serving one year each as State Secretary, State Treasurer, State Advocate, and State Warden. He also served as District Deputy for District #1 Fraternal years 2006 - 2008, Grand Knight of Council 4584 from July 2004 – June 2005, and Faithful Navigator for Assembly 2058 July 2004 – June 2005. He was State Round Table Chairman from July 2007 – June 2009. He has served as Marion Hour Chairman from July 2014 to present. He started a mentorship program of PGKs and FFNs in his Council and Assembly to assist elected officers to better understand their duties and responsibilities. Sir Knight/Brother Bryant was Knight of the Year for his Council and Sir Knight of the year in his Assembly; he was also selected as District Deputy of the year for the State of Arizona and received the Star District Award from Supreme Council.

He has been involved in the Boy Scouts of America for over 50 years and has served as Cub Master, Scout Master, and Scouting Coordinator, earning the Wood Badge award and the Bronze Pelican award. He was the original coordinator for the Fry Pioneer Cemetery clean-up program in Sierra Vista, AZ. He has been active in his Parishes youth program by serving as a Life Teen and EDGE Core member.

He serves as a Eucharistic Minister in his Parish and is a member of the Jail Ministry Team. He is a member of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem -Western USA Lieutenancy.

Bryant leads a group of National and Inter-National Captains from the Military Intelligence Captains Career Course (MI-CCC) from Fort Huachuca in a weekly community service project in Sierra Vista, he is also the leader of the Carmichael Neighborhood Response Team (C-NRT) that cleans up the low income Carmichael Community in Sierra Vista.

Bryant was selected as the John H. Reddin Province Arizona District Master in 2016. He completed his first two year term and will be completing is second term soon

I was raised in the neighboring town of Farmingdale. I attended St. Killian's Catholic school 1st thru 8th grade and was an altar boy when our mass was in Latin. I graduated from Farmingdale H.S. in 1964 and gave college. Placing a 17 year old in college in a state that had an 18 year old drinking age turned out not to be conducive to learning. In 1966, I decided to forgo a college education and enlisted in the U.S. Navy. Four years later and a tour of Viet Nam brought me home to a country in social turmoil with regard to the Viet Nam war. Prior to my overseas tour I met my bride to be. Once out of the service we got engaged on Halloween, 1970 and married the following year, October 2, 1971. This year will be 49 years and counting.

I initially went to work for Western Electric but massive layoffs due to the economy in 1975 saw me out of work. We decided to move away from the east coast and initially headed to New Mexico. While there we migrated to the Denver area where my sister lived with her family. There, where I was looking for work in the construction field, I took the test to become a police officer and applied for three different agencies. I was hired by the Greeley Police Department on August 1, 1976. Upon completing the police academy, I continued my studies at Aims Community College and graduated in December 1979 with an Associate's Degree in Criminal Justice. Just the year before, we had our first child, my son Roger Jr. on July 18, 1978. The police field agreed with me as I became a Detective in February 1979 and was promoted to Sergeant in August, 1982. Just prior to the promotion we had our 2nd child, our daughter Jeanine on August 24, 1981. Upon my promotion I went back to school and graduated in December, 1985 Magna Cum Laude with a Business Administration degree from Regis College. In August of 1987, I was promoted to Lieutenant where I served an additional 19 years in various command positions to include Patrol, Investigations, Administration, Drug Task Force and Special Operations (SWAT). After 30 years, I retired on November 4, 2006. My last day was memorable as our city had a visit by then President George W Bush. My assignment attached to the Secret Service unit in charge of his protection and they ensured that I was able to meet him on my last day of work.

My career with the Knights actually began at a very young age as my dad was a Knight and he encouraged me to join the Columbian Squires in 1958. In 1962, I became the Chief Squire of the Circle. When I turned 18, I did forgo joining the Knights as I moved out of the house to do my own thing. I did not become a Knight until I was in Colorado and on Columbus Day, 1989 I became a Knight. On Valentine's Day 1990, I took my major degrees and in February 1991, I took my 4th Degree. I became the Grand Knight of my council, 2160 in 1995. This July 4th we are celebrating our 100th year. In 1999, I took on two positions. One was the Faithful Navigator of my Assembly 89 and the other was the District Deputy of District #1 that consisted of 7 councils.

Besides my start of a state position of DD in 1999, I became the State Membership Director in 2001 thru 2003 making the Circle of Honor both years, with one of those years being number 3 in the Order. In 2003 I made my run through the state chairs serving two years in each as State Warden, State Advocate, State Treasurer, State Secretary and State Deputy leaving with 2 years as the Immediate Past State Deputy. My first year as State Deputy we hosted the Supreme Convention in Denver at which time I served as the Co-Chair with PSD Deacon Price Hatcher. I have also served at the State Ceremonial Director and in 2016 I was appointed as the District Master of Colorado. During those years my family has grown as my son, who serves as a Colorado Springs police officer and daughter-in-law, a teacher have 3 boys, 16, 13, 12 and my daughter, who serves as a Victim Advocate for the Air Force and son-in-law, a computer engineer, have a girl and boy, 6 and 5 and a little girl that is due this September 15th.

Hello John H. Reddin Province, my name is Francisco "Frank" Carmona, and I am the current and outgoing Utah District Master. I was born in Los Angeles in the late 1970s, and I am one of three boys born to immigrants from the mountains of Durango, Mexico. As a young child and my teen years, I spent my summer vacations on my Grandfathers Ranch down in Durango, Mexico. I graduated High School in 1995 and joined the US Army Infantry Division in 1997.

In basic training, there was not much to do besides training, running, shooting, and digging, but on Sunday's we had the option to stay in the barracks cleaning or go to Mass. Mass sounded a lot more appealing. Once my three-year term was up, I had enough money for my education. The Utah District is a healthy district coming along with its challenges and overcoming obstacles like every other district. The difference is we do it in style and smile while we take the hits. In the fall of 2018, we created one of four programs called "Socks for Heroes." Socks for Heroes were a project that concentrated on collecting winter socks from civilians to donate to our US Veterans. "SFH" could not be possible without the help of our Worth District Marshals leading the charge. Some brother Knights doubted us, and some even made fun of us for trying a new project this massive. We had parishes get involved; even my child's school in Summit Academy in Draper UT participated. This program was hugely successful in that other districts across the United States adopted the project. In the State of Utah, we have many Veterans Homes and Hospitals from as far South as Saint George, and as far north as Logan, we managed to fill every one of those hospitals with winter socks to US Veterans. The Utah District has donated more than 13,000 pairs of winter socks to US Veterans across the state, and we hope to keep on doing it year after year.

The Second program we introduce was **American Patriot Service Corp**) apscnp.org. This program allowed us to locate lost widows and families of Veterans on how to have pending benefits that they might not know existed. Congress has set aside HUNDREDS of MILLIONS of dollars of funding for eligible wartime Veterans & their Surviving Spouses. Veterans (age 65 years and older) and their Surviving Spouses may qualify for a tax-free VA pension called Aid & Attendance. The VA helps Veterans and their families cope with financial challenges by providing supplemental income through the Veterans Pension benefit. Our mission is to help them understand and apply for the VA pension and health care benefits they may be entitled to. We are dedicated to serving our Veterans and their Surviving Spouses. Receive up to \$2,846 monthly with the Aid & Attendance Benefit.

What Does APSC Do?

The mission of American Patriot Service Corp. is to serve our military veterans and their families by helping veterans and their surviving spouses apply for pension and health care benefits from the Department of Veterans Affairs.

How Can They Help?

Your membership and donations are much appreciated. With your help, we can generate tens of thousands of dollars for a typical veteran or surviving spouse over the balance of his/her life.

Eligibility & Qualification

VA offers two broad categories of Pension benefit programs:

- **1. Veterans Pension:** Tax-free monetary benefit payable to low-income wartime Veterans
- 2. Survivors Pension: Tax-free monetary benefit payable to a low-income, unremarried Surviving Spouse and unmarried child (ren) of a deceased Veteran with wartime service. Veterans and survivors who are eligible for Pension benefits and are housebound or require the aid and attendance of another person may be eligible to receive additional monetary amounts. If you are 65 and older_or inquiring for a loved one who is 65 and older, please fill out the form and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Eligibility

- 1. The Veteran must have served at least 90-days of active military service, one day of which was during a period of war (dates shown below)
- 2. The Veteran must have received a discharge other than "dishonorable." This is documented by providing a certified copy of the DD Form 214 (report of separation).
- 3. The claimant must be a Veteran who qualifies under items 1 and 2 above, or be the Surviving Spouse of a qualifying Veteran and was married to the Veteran at his/her death and has not remarried.
- 4. The Veteran must have served during these wartime dates:
 - 1. WWII 12/07/1941 12/31/1946
 - 2. Korea $\frac{06}{27} \frac{1950}{1950} \frac{01}{31} \frac{1955}{1955}$
 - 3. Vietnam 08/05/1964 07/07/1975 (*February 28, 1961 August 4, 1964, in theater)

Qualifications

- 1. First, the Veteran or Surviving Spouse must meet the eligibility requirements referred to above.
- 2. Second, the Veteran or Surviving Spouse must require the aid and attendance of another person.
- 3. Third, meet the financial need requirements: this refers to income, assets, unreimbursed medical costs, etc...

In the Third Project, we created a scholarship program. The Utah District would like to give away a \$1000 scholarship to a deserving graduating or college student at the next state convention. We accomplish this in 2020, and we hope to do it again. With the leadership of our FVSM Chuck Dover Jr. and the District Marshals in 2021, we plan on giving away at least two \$1000.00 scholarships. Please stay tuned for more information.

The final District of Utah project concentrated on our first-responders and the distress children they encounter. In 2019 and 2020, The Utah District collected and donated over 5000 stuffed animals to various police, fire, and EMP high crime agencies around the state. With the leadership of District Marshal Richard Vigor, Stacey Yeager, PFN Richard Hall, and IPSD Andy Airriess, this event was possible. It was there tenacious and his ability to communicate with various agencies, churches, GKS, FNS, PSDs, and the State Council that the Utah District was successful with our new project. Even Covid-19 has not stopped them from collecting. We spent over two (2) weeks distributing all the plush animals to the high crime agencies.

Change hearts and minds about abortion by showing that the Knights of Columbus loves both mother and child before and after birth. Councils can provide material, financial, labor and other support to pro-life pregnancy centers that help women during pregnancy and following the birth of their newborn children.



Overview

More than 3,000 pro-life pregnancy centers now operate throughout territories of the Knights of Columbus. By the very nature of its founding, the Knights of Columbus is called to care for the widow and orphan. AS YOU RETURN TO THE PEW A seven- step guide for attending Mass after lockdown By Gerald Korson6/26/2020

In many parts of the U.S. and Canada, churches had been closed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. But now, Masses are resuming in a limited fashion, with social-distancing guidelines implemented in various ways by dioceses and local parishes.

It's not the same as before. Attendance is restricted in some areas to a fraction of capacity. And, because elderly or immune-compromised parishioners are not able to risk public exposure, local bishops generally have temporarily suspended the obligation to attend Mass.

So seating is limited, the safety procedures are unusual, you might have to wear a face mask, and attendance isn't obligatory. What should you do, then? Here is your seven-step guide to navigating the return to Mass.

Step 1. Go to Mass anyway. If you normally attend Mass only because it's an obligation, then you're missing out. In the Mass, you can receive the Eucharist, the body and blood of Christ, with your fellow believers. There is no greater expression of the Body of Christ, the Communion of Saints. It's a privilege not to be taken lightly.

After weeks of watching Mass on television or social media, we might feel a certain hunger for the Eucharist. Let's offer prayers of thanksgiving that the Eucharist is available to us once again. Remember that the word "Eucharist" derives from a Greek word meaning "thanksgiving."

Naturally, if you have serious health reasons, then it might be prudent to wait on Mass a bit longer.

Step 2. Follow directions. Your local parish might require you enter through particular doors, wear a facemask, use hand sanitizer, or avoid congregating before and after Mass. You might find that ushers will escort you to your seats, as well as direct you when you may leave. Communion procedures might be in place, and the sign of peace will likely be dropped. There might be no congregational singing or instrumental music only.

Don't groan or roll your eyes. Relax. You might not get that favorite pew you want, and wearing a mask in church might seem a bit surreal. But why sweat the small stuff? You're used to being directed to a table at restaurants, and you'll practice similar social-distancing measures in any public building. The liturgy might seem a bit more somber, but let's face it: These are somber times.

So roll with it. Think of the many Catholics around the world over the centuries who have had to participate in Mass under difficult circumstances — on battlefields, in prison camps or in the catacombs, for example. By comparison, this is a piece of cake.

Step 3. Remember the collection. The pandemic and lockdown have hit churches hard. Even parishes that offer electronic giving options receive most of their weekly contributions through the collection basket. If you haven't kept up your giving in recent months and you have not taken a serious income hit yourself, it's time to catch up with your parish giving. In fact, consider putting in a little extra to help support the parish's mission.

Step 4. Avoid judging. Attendance might be smaller than you expect. You might notice some regulars missing. Don't assume they have grown lazy or lukewarm. Those who aren't at Mass might have legitimate reasons. Pray for them.

Step 5. Invite others to return. By the same token, when you meet or speak with other Catholics afterward, encourage them to return to Mass. Express joy that you've been able to do so yourself. You might help some overcome their fears that way.

Step 6. Get back to the box. There's more than just Mass awaiting your return. Confessions were hard to come by in many areas during the pandemic, often limited to special requests or creative drive-by opportunities, but scheduled times should resume soon. If you haven't been for a while, gather the family and get in line. Let's all thank God for the grace and forgiveness he offers us through the sacrament of penance.

Step 7. Gradually resume parish life. If all goes well, things should return to normal with time. Watch for service opportunities to open up further as parish ministries resume. As a Knight of Columbus, your council will likely be on the front lines in serving your parish and the larger community. You can be a part of that.

The "new normal" at Mass might seem inconvenient or uncomfortable at first, but it's a small act of charity we can offer for the protection of the most vulnerable members of our communities.
