STATE DEPUTY'S MESSAGE

Happy New Year (again) and Merry Christmas! Brothers we did it, we made it to 2021. This past year has had its challenges to say the least but I would like to thank you for your support and efforts. The question now is what can we do with 2021?

Despite 2020's challenges we have done some amazing things and I think it is important to reflect on those to know what we can do moving forward. The challenges we have faced are opportunities if we look at them as such and act on them. One prime example was the windstorm we had, the chaos and damage allowed the Knights here in Utah an opportunity to come together and support our Carmelite sisters. Over the course of 3 Saturdays, we had 50 plus Knights and family members come together to do the manual work of charity. I was so moved seeing over 20 councils represented. We also combined efforts with Supreme and were able to donate \$8,000 to assist them, and that number continues to increase as we are still collecting donations.

The Native American community was hit very hard by the Coronavirus and the Knights in Utah again took this challenge as an opportunity. Our council in Cedar City has made several runs over to an area hit very hard by this pandemic bringing thousands of pounds of food and supplies; and our council in Magna took their own trip to support another area affected. At the state level we collected donations from councils and individuals and were able to give over \$6,700 to help in this time of need.

While the pandemic forced us to change the way we do things for our Coats for Kids distributions, we still found other ways to support our Utah community and gave out over 750 coats. This was more than we gave out last year; and we also raised more money than in previous years totaling just over \$7,000.

These are just 3 examples of things done, with your support, at the state level; and I'm sure there are many more examples at the local level of things you are doing like a drive through spaghetti dinner in Vernal, breakfast burritos to go in North Ogden, or coffee and donuts outside and socially distanced in Taylorsville. We will be discussing things like this at the Midyear Meeting and I hope you share your successes and ideas with the entire state.

Our state Midyear Meeting as you know will be held virtually on January 9th; I think we had an amazing kick off Organizational Meeting virtually back in June and this Midyear Meeting should be equally as good. I look forward to seeing everyone at the Midyear Meeting and making this year one of our best ever despite the challenges we face. Let's focus on what we can do, not what we can't. Thank you for all you do and will do!

JUDGES NEEDED FOR KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS DIOCESAN SCIENCE FAIR

The 25th Annual **Knights of Columbus Diocesan Science and Engineering Fair** will be held online this year on Saturday, **February 6th**. From 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. This new format will allow students to continue to strive for excellence in science and engineering, while allowing for student and judge safety during the COVID-19 pandemic. Students will be invited to upload their projects as presentation sides (PowerPoint slides or a similar format) onto a virtual fair website. Judges will be assigned to specific projects and provided with a schedule of remote interviews for the day of the fair. As is the case with many things in our schools, the virtual fair is a new process for all of us. We appreciate your patience as we adapt to keep the science fair running through the pandemic. If you are interested in helping us by serving as a judge for our virtual fair this year, please register (**by January 28th** if possible) on the website at: http://ut-dsef.zfairs.com/ ("Create Account" section on the right side).

We encourage judges to judge from home if possible. However, if you are interested in judging but do not have adequate computer or internet capabilities at home, we will provide access to a limited number of computers at Juan Diego Catholic High School (300 East 11800 South, Draper) on the day of the fair. In the online registration, you will be asked to select whether you are able to judge from home or whether you need to use a computer at JDCHS.

The Substance Abuse Awareness Poster Contest is open to ages 8 — 11 and 12—14. The contest has two category divisions: "Alcohol Awareness and Abuse" and "Drug Awareness and Abuse". Timeline:

1/31/2021 — Councils receive posters for the contest.

Select 1st/2nd/3rd in each age group & category.

Announce winners and award prizes from council.

- 2/21/2021 Council first place winners to District Deputy (one for each age group & category).
- 3/15/2021 District Deputy submits (first place in each age/category) winners to State Chairman Bill McCauley for state judging.
- 4/15/2021 State (first place) winners selected for each age/category.
- Pro Tips:The 1/31 deadline can be adjusted by the council, as long as council winners are to their District Deputy by 2/21.
DD can be flexible about the 2/21 deadline; the district winners need to be selected and submitted by 3/15.
Entry forms can be distributed after Mass at the parish, or through your local catholic school.

Councils can determine their own prizes of cash and/or certificates and/or something else. The State will award certificates and a check for \$25, \$20, or \$15 for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winning posters in each age group and category.



Adopt-A-Parish by Council 15418

District Master Dick Hall, Past Grand Knight of Saint Ambrose Council 15418 is show here with the icon Our Lady Help of Persecuted Christians. The icon was presented to the Saint Ambrose Council and the parish by Greg Keller, PSD for work done over the last three years.

The council's efforts included \$25,500 to rebuild homes in the Iraqi city of Karamles a project sponsored by Supreme to help Persecuted Christians in the middle East. Following that effort, Council 15418 and Saint Ambrose parish worked to support Father Wael Al-Shabi and the Saint Elia Al-Heiri Alhei Chaldean Catholic parish in the diocese of Baghdad. This is a pilot project known as Adopt-A-Parish through Supreme KofC. The council raised \$2,500 last year for support of Father Wael. The goal this year is to raise another \$2,500. There is a web site where anyone may aid in support of the cause. This web directs all funds to help Fr Wael. All credit card charges are covered by Supreme so 100% of funds donated go to the Fr Wael.

Over the last month and a half, I have had the privilege to participate with you my brother knights at six Coats for Kids' distribution locations throughout the Salt Lake Valley. Although these events had lower than expected attendance, the State in total distributed more coats in Utah than we have in prior years and we reached out to more communities who are need throughout the state. A shout out to brother Frank Carmona, and the Grand Knights who made this a very successful program this year.

As an update to our charitable contributions, here is where we currently stand at the end of December: Native Americans \$2565; Carmelite Nuns \$5,795; Coats for Kids \$7,839; Ultrasound \$579 and Special Olympics at \$2,050. Thank you, my brother knights for your kindness in supporting these important charities.



One thing I need help from Grand Knights and Financial Secretaries this month is acquiring data for and submitting the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity Form 1728 that is due on Jan 31. Please email your council membership. the form 1728A worksheet, if you have not already done so. to get the information back to complete and submit the report to Supreme on time (due by January 31st). Please cc me a copy. As a reminder, this is a required form to meet your Star Council Award requirement.

In the administrative area, I would like to mention a few items. Hopefully, most of you have sent out your council per capita assessments to your membership by now. With this, I would like to encourage council officers to budget for the four state funds: Christopher Fund, Vocations Fund, Culture of Life Fund and the Scholarship Fund. These funds go to critical programs in our diocese and we need your continued support. There are still 7 councils than need to submit their semiannual audit (Form 1295-1, Due August 15th) from the prior period (January 1—June 30). Also, need some help on updates to Service Program Personnel Reports (Form #365) so we may get our Safe Environment Training Program compliant.

Again, thanks for your assistance on these matters, and if any of you have any questions or issues please reach out to me. I look forward to meeting with all of you on January 9th for the Midyear Meeting.



SAINT MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL ICON PROGRAM



There are some COVID-19 related adjustments to our new Saint Michael the Archangel prayer service for the Pilgrim Icon Program. Considering the nature of the Pilgrim Icon Program, Supreme has determined it would be better to wait to launch this program when members can meet face to face. For this reason, it was decided that it is best to delay the launch of this Icon program until the next fraternal year (which starts July 2021).

Icons are a physical manifestation of a sacred reality, and there is real grace to being in physical proximity of the blessed image for this program. To launch the Saint Michael prayer service during a time when many Knights and their communities cannot safely participate in person would be a significant loss to the program. This delay is understandably frustrating for many of our councils who may have been expecting to host the image of Saint Michael starting in January, and that this delay leaves a void in our Faith program line-up.

However, this news offers an opportunity as well. Supreme has nearly completed a new Blessed Michael McGivney Prayer Hour resource which will help us honor our newly beatified founder and continue to seek his aid together. This prayer hour, which is designed for remote participation, will serve as a substitute for the Icon Program for this fraternal year. Detailed instructions and a recording of the prayer service will be made available to you this coming January.

As always, our goal for faith programs is to promote public devotion and to strengthen our Catholic faith. I look forward to accomplishing this goal with you — for now, virtually, but with the hope that soon all our programs will once again be safe to run in person.

I will provide any additional information regarding

this new Pilgrim Icon Program as soon as I receive it. The plan, depending how many Icons we receive, will be to rotate (about monthly), by District, starting from the North and working South. The Districts can distribute between councils or pool their resources to make the best use of their time, resources and locations.
