It has been my pleasure to serve as your State Secretary this past year. As your State Secretary I completed all of my duties to the best of my ability including: all assessments were invoiced in a timely manner, all receipts of funds were created and given to the State Treasurer along with all warrants were created and transmitted for payment of debts of the Utah State Council. The financial records kept by me as the State Secretary are in conformity with the accounting software maintained by the State Treasurer, James "Mac" McManaman.

During my second year as State Secretary I have continued to build upon previous and make new improvements to some of our procedures. For example, the transition was made to an electronic filing system for our warrants and receipts last year and that system continues to be refined. It allows electronic transmission of those documents between the State Secretary and State Treasurer and helps us use our accounting software more effectively assisting with the annual review/audit. Last year the state council assessments were transitioned to being done electronically and continues to be refined. This allows us to track them more effectively throughout the fraternal year but also helps provide some historical reference for future years.

A couple of recent improvements were transitioning to some online forms, one for collecting the Necrology and Perpetual Memorial book information and the other for completing the convention delegate certification form. Both improvements have made the state more efficient, but also made the submitting of this information more user friendly and timely for council leadership. I continue to maintain the state "Dashboard" I created last year that is used for tracking membership and council status which in turns provides a tracking system on our website for councils and districts.

As we are coming to the end of this fraternal year during this time of crisis with the COVID-19 virus, I pray that we all come out of this safely. While I would not have wished this on us here in Utah or anywhere, I would like to focus on the good that can come from it. Reverend Fathers, Worthy State Deputy, my fellow State Officers, and my Brother Knights,



Last year's audit report was prepared by Haynie and Company and we were found to be practicing good financial procedures. This report was received by the Supreme Council and was found to be in compliance and the information provided was added to the records of the Supreme Secretary's office. At the conclusion of our current fraternal year the state books will be sent to Haynie and Company for completion of our annual audit.

As your State Treasurer I have continued the direction of previous State Treasurers looking for ways to improve and better serve our councils and the state. This year has presented new challenges and as State Treasurer I have worked with the other State Officers to meet our commitments, plan for the future and adapt to the new normal in our world today. We have made every effort to control spending and serve the needs of our councils. This year we lost quite a few members and it has had an impact on our State income. The budget I have sent to the Grand Knights for approval has all our needs addressed without having to increase per capita. We are using reserve funds that were made possible by limiting our spending knowing this shortfall was coming. I know each council is experiencing the effects of COVID-19 and our inability to meet and raise funds. This has been felt across the board and the State Officers have worked hard to minimize the impact this virus is having on all of us. Our plan is to work through this together with the adjustments that allow us to continue to provide our parishes, priest and our Faith the support Knights are known for. This budget will be reviewed, finalized and approved at the State Convention.

May we all continue to do God's work as faithful men of the Knights of Columbus and in doing so honor the vision of our founder, the Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney.

Reverend Fathers, Worthy Supreme Representative, State Officers and my Brother Knights,

I would like to thank all of you for supporting the 113th State Convention, your Parish Communities and your State Council. I sincerely appreciate you providing me the opportunity to serve as your State Advocate and the great support rendered during the past two Fraternal Years.

2020 has started off to be a challenging year as a result of the COVID-19 virus for numerous people including the Knights around the world. This event and others have hurt us on growing membership to offset losses within the State; 386 losses in FY19-20. However, on a positive note, your retention efforts on 599 Knight intent letters have resulted in retaining 213 members (35.6%). Therefore, to prevent losses from occurring in the future, I encourage you to reach out at least quarterly to your entire council by phone, text, email and snail mail to maintain contact. Over 33% of the state retention letters that I sent out were returned due to bad addresses since the Post Office only forwards mail for three months.

In the area of Safe Environment, as of APR19, we stand at 68% compliant across the State. Thank you to those GKs and FSs who submitted their Form 365s and motivated members within their council to complete this critical training. To attain 100% in safe environment by year end, we only need 27 Knights to complete their training. This credentialing is key to not only meeting compliance criteria, but also ensuring that our Youth have a Safe Environment when we support their activities.

Other activities I supported this year included active membership on degree teams and candidate registration for the Patriotic Degree. I renewed our State Liability Insurance Policy and acquired Liability Insurance Coverage riders for several councils. I have worked with councils for EIN acquisition, 990-N tax filings, and incorporating council EINs under the Supreme Council. And last but not least, I revised and published an updated State by Laws Guide and prepared the 2020 resolutions for this convention.

Again this year, many of you voiced concerns on several issues and hopefully I addressed them in a timely manner to your satisfaction. Throughout the year, I interfaced with the Supreme Advocate's Office and Membership Records to clarify protocols or bring outstanding items to a closure.

Hopefully with your support, I look forward to serving as your State Secretary next fraternal year. It has been an absolute honor and privilege to serve you on the State Council for the last two years. After this terrible pandemic, I look forward to getting back to work supporting our core principles of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity and rebuilding Utah as a leading Jurisdiction in our beloved order. God Bless all of you my Brother Knights to you and your families for all that you do to support the Utah Knights.

## *District Master's Report* *Francisco "Frank" Carmona, District Master - Utah*

### **John H. Reddin Province – Utah District Biannual Meeting 2018-2020**

The Health of the Patriotic Degree in this District is excellent. The change of leadership and the appointment of a New Vice Supreme Master made things a little more nerve-racking. Once we learned that our New Vice Supreme Master was PSD Richard Espinoza from New Mexico, the uncertainty went away. Working with VSM Espinoza as a District Master made the communication approachable and straightforward. The Utah District was on task to meet the membership goal we, unfortunately, just like all the other events in the State of Utah and across the county, the Forth-Degree has been put on hold. In 2018-2019 the Utah District was able to accomplish our goal of 100% membership, two out of four in our province. For the Fraternal Year 2019-2020, we held one (1) regular Exemplification that resulted in 14 new members into the Fourth-Degree. The Exemplification in March was canceled due to the

Pandemic; we are awaiting word from The Supreme Master if our two remaining Exemplifications will be revoked or not. The two remaining Exemplifications scheduled for May 20<sup>th</sup> hosted by our New Assembly 2577 for Clergy only and one on June 13<sup>th</sup> sponsored by Assembly 1144. We currently have 12,375 members in the John H Redding Province of those 1,112 members of the Patriotic Degree in Utah, down 8% from last year. We are 20% of our goal of 78 New Sir Knights. Utah has the highest percentage of Sir Knights to Knights in the Order at 33% of our members are Sir Knights. At most of the Exemplifications, we had a robust attendance of Knights in the Forth-Degree Uniform and as witnesses. At the banquets, we have continued the traditions from both Former Masters by including in our ceremonies for the MIA/POW, Knights appreciation (Award of Merit), roses for our wives, memorials for recently deceased Sir Knights, and a flag presentation given to the class honoree.

#### **Honor Guard and Color Corps Activities:**

Since the retirement of the Classic Regalia, honor guard participation is down about 75% because most Sir Knights do not have the Fourth Degree Uniform. I encourage every able Fourth-Degree Sir Knight to get the uniform and begin participating as we did in the past. There is no reason for us not to be visible and active in events like Confirmations, First Communions, parades, and many other Masses.

The Patriotic Degree is involved in many projects. Our commitment to the Special Olympics continues. We have a large number of participants in the opening flag ceremonies; several more Knights in their attire take part in a "High Five" upon the entrance of the athletes, and most Councils and Assemblies offer financial support to the athletes. We continue to support the Fisher House at the George Whalen VA Hospital. Bishop Solis is a big supporter of the Knights. He encourages men to become members of the Order and his Priests to become Fourth-Degree members. Assemblies are involved in parades, Memorial presentations, VAVS, and sponsor banquet and other events for our Veterans.

Many events have been canceled or postponed because of the pandemic; First Communions, Confirmations, parades, and special masses after March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020. We cannot conduct a virtual honor guard, so those events are on hold. Before our events where canceled, we participated for the second time in our newest exhibition, "Tim Tebow's Night to Shine."

The Patriotic Degree members continue to support their Sir Knights at funeral Masses and vigils for our members and their families; Clergy retirement Masses and celebrations; State meetings including the organization, mid-year, and convention; Pro-Life marches, rosaries, and Masses; Flag Day ceremonies throughout the State; and parades/festivals (Veterans Day, Draper Days, Taylorsville, St. Patrick's and others). The Utah District continues to grow and be involved in many of the Patriotic events and parish activities in the state.

We continue to offer a Resolution of Condolence to the family of our fallen Sir Knights; we have also participated with the US Military in celebrating a landed knight and current service members. The involvement of the District Marshals and District Master in our honor guards has elevated to new heights. The Utah District team, known as "**The Regulators**," has taken honor/color standards.

Retiring of the Classic Regalia at the State Convention in 2019 was a high light that spread across the KofC world; thanks to DM Stacey Yeager, this event was suggested to all District Masters in our order. It is new ideas like these that make The Utah District stand out from the rest; we are united and work together to keep it bright for liberty's sake.

## MEMORANDUM

### **Laws and Rules Governing the Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus**

#### *ARTICLE XII COLOR CORPS Section 41:*

The Establishment of **(a)** Assembly may henceforth establish a uniform drill corps with the approval of the Master of the District, and such unit shall be known as "Fourth Degree Color Corps of \_\_\_\_ Assembly." **(b)** A Color Corps may participate in exemplifications, religious, and public functions only with the consent of the Master. The Master shall have full control of the Color Corps in his district, except as from now on, provided and shall be held strictly accountable for such unit. **(c)** The Faithful Navigator shall appoint a Commander of the Color Corps for his Assembly. One and only one Commander shall be appointed.

- The District Marshal is a representative of the District Master, and since the District Master shall have full control of the Color Corps in his district, so shall the District Marshals.
- M. Todd Holzhauser is the Chief Marshal of the Utah District and second in control of the Utah District.
- M. Stacey A. Yeager is the Marshal in control of all the District training; all color corps training is to be coordinated through him.
- District Marshals will be in command of all Assembly or District Color Corps when they are in attendance in or out of there areas whether the District Master is there or not.
- Color Corps Commanders will take control of the Color Corps when there is NO District Marshal in Attendance, whether the District Master is in attendance or not.

### Continuing with the Three (3) New District Programs

#### **Socks for Heroes**

We have launched a "NEW" Statewide District Campaign to help our homeless US Veterans. Just as the State Council has the program "Coats for Kids," the Utah State Assembly is introducing to you "Socks for Heroes." Our goal is to collect as many "NEW" pair of socks to hand out to our homeless Vets, one pair or two at a time. A team of Sir Knights from around the state, together with our active US Military Members, will be stationed at St. Vincent's mess hall for the homeless in SLC on Thanksgiving to pass these out. For those of you Active Military, Veterans, In-Active Military, Hunters, Fisherman, First Responders, and Outdoorsman, you know the importance of dry clean feet. Please join in collecting Socks for Heroes by passing out the word to your place of employment, parishes, and bring this up at your council/assembly meeting in "Report of the 4th Degree". Chances are you have a 4th-Degree member at a council meeting that also attends assembly meetings who can bring those socks and give them to the FN, Marshal, or UTDM. I thank you all for your support and love for our US Veterans. In two (2) years, we have donated over 12,500 pairs of warm socks to our US Veterans who are struggling. Great job, team.

#### **American Patriot Service Corps**

APSCNP.org is the charity to achieve this mission. Simply put, APSC assists veterans and their surviving spouses apply for pension and health care benefits from the Department of Veterans Affairs. We know of the difficulty Ailing process to the VA. We've heard of the countless claims rejections because of red tape. The frustrations of vets' families seem insurmountable. APSC cuts through the paper maze by assisting vets, explaining, and submitting claims submission at no charge! A 501c3 charity since 2011, APSC assistance yielded over 110 million dollars in approved claims with almost twice that many claims

currently pending. Knights will join forces with APSC by assisting in locating those-in-need – vets, families, and widows and by pledging fundraising efforts to “serve those who served us!”

### **Kids in Crises Stuffed Animal Drive**

The Utah District introduced KIDS in CRISIS Stuffed Animal Drive. This allowed all Councils and Assemblies to participate with the various Law Enforcement agencies and Fire Departments at having asked for our help. We collected NEW or gently used Stuffed Animals of all colors, shapes, and sizes for donation to Utah Law Enforcement and Fire Departments for Kids in Crisis. Police Officer and Fire Fighters carry around these stuffed animals in their vehicles to provide them to Kid in Crisis when they show up for a house call, accident, or violent situation in attempts to calm children down. Three Ex-Law Enforcement Sir Knights from different assemblies will have spearheaded this new project in Utah. In 2019 we donated over 3500 pairs of stuffed animals to Police agencies, medical personal, and firefighters in bad areas. They were very receptive and loved the fact we did this for the children. This year should be great again.

## *Ceremonials Director: SK Karl A. VanMaren, FDD*

April 11, 2020

Brother Knights,

Ceremonials have been interesting this fraternal year. Everything was fine until November. Remember what happened? The Supreme Council announced the new “Exemplification of Charity, Unity and Fraternity” and previewed it at the State Deputy meeting in Orlando, and also invited the State Ceremonial Chairmen (from the USA and Canada) to Orlando to witness it and receive information the day after the State Deputy meeting. It was quite the whirlwind trip, I left Saturday night (11/23), we met Sunday afternoon (11/24) and Monday morning (11/25), and I was back in Utah by that same night.

Right away we knew this was a game changer. I think I called it the “biggest change to ceremonials in the history of our order.” Why? **The new ceremonial exemplification is no longer secret!** Families are invited to observe as men become Knights of Columbus. The combined ceremonial is quick (a little more than half an hour, depending on how many candidates), and ceremonial robes are no longer used. Actually, most of the props from the former individual 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> degree ceremonials are also no longer necessary. They did omit was how to salute, and what the number of gavel raps mean during a meeting – just help the new members with those at the meetings.

Knights were excited about the new ceremonial, while also having a sense of nostalgia about the former ceremonials. To ease the transition, the Supreme Council let each State Deputy decide if/how the new ceremonials and previous ceremonials would be used. State Deputy Greg Keller let us know that here in Utah, we’re welcome to use the new one as soon as we’re ready, while also allowing the former ceremonials – if there was a need for them.

To further accelerate the change, State Deputy Greg Keller also had me to order the supplies to put together two “ceremonial kits” for councils/districts to borrow as needed. The ceremonial baldrics took the longest to arrive (ordered on 2/4, received on 3/9). With the increased demand the ceremonial baldrics were on back order for weeks, but requests are still being accepted and processed at [www.KofCSupplies.com](http://www.KofCSupplies.com) with shipments happening as the items are restocked. They shipped the fibers and cables right away, and we used them on 2/20 at Saint Thomas More in Cottonwood Heights along with borrowed ceremonial baldrics.

The six ceremonial baldrics along with a crucifix, fibers and cable, prayer cards, and copies of the scripts (in English, Spanish and French) will be in a carrying case clearly labeled as property of the Utah State Council, along with a reminder to whom it should be returned. The *State Ceremonial Chairman* will have one of the kits, and the *State Warden* will have the other. Councils will still need to provide the “Candidate Kit” that includes the rosary and lapel pin.

There are still some supply items that the Supreme Council will update. Later in 2020 we’re expecting new honoree certificates (and scrolls), and a new Constitutional Roll will be available in a book format which should make it even easier to use. Use the supplies you have.

It didn’t seem like it at the time, but the new ceremonial was available fairly quickly:

- January 11<sup>th</sup> – previewed the new ceremonial (via video) after the State Council’s mid-year meeting at Saint Ambrose in Salt Lake City. The initial FAQ document was shared at the meeting.
- January 16<sup>th</sup> – English script (PDF) available, along with the updated FAQ.
- January 27<sup>th</sup> – French Script (PDF) available, along with the updated FAQ.
- February 7<sup>th</sup> – Spanish Script (PDF) available, along with the updated FAQ.

- Council 5214, May 16<sup>th</sup>, English and Spanish, at Maronite Church in Taylorsville.

**Reminders:**

- **Joining the Knights can still be done online at [www.kofc.org/joinus](http://www.kofc.org/joinus).** They should indicate they want to join your council (make sure they have the council #), then it's easy to transfer them into your council **after** they go through the new ceremonial. This is done by the Financial Secretary through member management on officers online [www.kofc.org/oo](http://www.kofc.org/oo)
- **Please assemble your council team!** For those that already have, thank you. Live ceremonials aren't that difficult (unless we're having a global pandemic). Live interaction helps with the message delivery and shows the ceremonials are significant. There are only a handful of speaking parts – and no memorization is required!
- **Practice is essential**, especially the interactions with the warden and candidate registration.
- **The District Deputy should add your exemplifications to the state ceremonials calendar.** Provide him all the useful information:
  - Date, candidate registration time (allow 15-30 minutes) and start time.
  - Location (including building and room for registration and the ceremony itself)
  - Contact person (name, email, phone number), for anyone with questions.
  - Honoree
- **The District Deputy still files the Form 450 to report on the ceremonial.** Please make sure he's invited. If he is unable to attend, provide the details for the report. [www.kofc.org/forms](http://www.kofc.org/forms) has the form (so you can see what information is required). As it says on the form, copies still go to the State Deputy (use [Utah.State.Deputy.Forms@gmail.com](mailto:Utah.State.Deputy.Forms@gmail.com)) and the State Ceremonial Chairman.
- **Sending the Form 100 to Supreme for new, reactivated and transferring members is now optional.** Enter the information from the Form 100 into the Officers Online website using the new "Candidate" tab and keep the paper form in the council's files. This new option was announced on 3/31, and the video instruction was included in the 4/2 webinar. As usual, the recorded webinar is available at [www.kofc.org/webinar](http://www.kofc.org/webinar).

This is my first year as the Community Director as of fall 2019. My goal was and is to continue funding these honorable programs that support the financial and medical needs of the healthcare community and those effected by MS. As you will read in my report it was a noteworthy and challenging year. The 2 major events that the Community Director helps the State with our Annual American Red Cross Reach Out Utah Blood Drive in December 17, 2019 and the Multiple Sclerosis (MS) Walk on April 25, 2020.

### **December 17, 2019: The Annual Red Cross Reach Out Utah Blood Drive**

The Blood Services Division of the American Red Cross relies on the Knights of Columbus to provide the of staffing for eight 'Blood Ambassador' positions and ensure a steady flow of blood donors from 7:00 AM to 6:00 PM. This year the Red Cross had a goal of 300 units of blood and collected 294 units of life saving blood! That was a total of our Utah blood donation centers, Salt Lake, Orem, Layton & St George. They expected a lower number of donations for the Reach Out Utah Blood Drive in Salt Lake because they had a blood drive at that location in November. Jessica the Market Manager commented, "We are very pleased with the results and the success of the event overall! The Knights of Columbus are a big part of that success and your volunteerism with us each year is highly valued and appreciated! "It was great seeing all of the Knights that day! It is always a pleasure and so much fun to be able to have you all there and hang out with you".

Thanks to all that donated blood. The Red Cross informed me that every unit of blood can save three lives, that means our volunteers hard work and dedication combined with other locations has the ability to save 882 lives in Utah. We had 22 plus K of C volunteers and combined provided 80 hours of service. I was overwhelmed by the generosity of time the Knights put forth at this annual event, again thank you brothers.

### **April 27, 2019: The MS Walk 2018 in West Jordan**

At the time of writing this report the MS Walk and donation efforts from the Knights will not be complete. I'm excited to see if anymore councils can contribute financially to this fight against MS. A parishioner at St. Joseph the Worker, Laurie Allen donated an Avon Products basket with over \$673.00 of valued items again for us to raffle off, a huge thank you to her. I have taken the basket to different council events (Bingo, meeting, wife's dinner) to sell raffle tickets. Unfortunately, with the pandemic that reached the US in Late February and all parish and Knights of Columbus supported events cancelled until further notice. 

## *Online Membership Chairman: SK Nick Nielson*

Reverend Fathers, Worthy State Deputy, my fellow State Officers, and my Brother Knights,

Last fraternal year (2018-2019) was the first full year of the ability to have Online Membership and we achieved online membership goal which helped our overall state membership. This fraternal year we set our goal for online membership to be 15% of our total intake goal which was 240.

The goal works out to be just over 3 online members per month, and for 6 of the of the 9 months this fraternal year we met or exceeded that goal, thank you for your efforts. At the time of our state convention we had brought in 24 online members which was 62% of our goal this fraternal year. For the state of Utah, 84% of the men that joined online were interested in joining a local council. We have had 75% of those interested complete the transfer process. The remaining men are still interested but we need to coordinate a time when they can attend a degree, or they still need to be contacted by the councils.

I believe the growth we have had with online membership has been organic and mainly generated by men wanting to join the Knights of Columbus but haven't had the chance to do so in person. With minimal effort and additional support of online membership from the councils I believe we could grow exponentially and be better positioned to serve our communities.

As we close out this fraternal year and during this time of social distancing we can utilize Online Membership as a tool to help gain new members quickly rather than having them wait, and then we can schedule a Degree at a time that works best for the candidates and when we can meet again in person.

The other great news is that Supreme is now holding a combined degree online. This will provide the opportunity to have men join online and then still be able to transfer into your local council while we are not able to meet. This process is a great way to still provide the opportunity to men to join the Knights of Columbus and give them a way to connect with our councils. Regarding the "paperwork" for transferring an online member or having them go through an online degree is very easy and efficient. The new process is all done through Officers Online and several Financial Secretaries and Grand Knights have commented that the sign up and transfer process was much easier than the traditional Form 100.

It has been my pleasure to serve as the Online Membership Chairman. I am happy to report that Online Membership has been very successful here in Utah and with your efforts it can be even more.

## Past State Deputies Addresses to Convention

### *SK Michael T. Cosgrove (1984-1986)*

I joined the Fr. DeSmet Council 5347 in Brigham City in 1965. I was elected State Deputy in 1984 and served through 1986. I am one of five Knights from the Brigham City Council to serve as State Deputy: Vince Kelly, 1972-1973, Tom O'Grady, 1978-1980, Robert Lavery, 1986-1988, Rholand Lange, 1994-1996.

I was, at that time, the youngest to be elected to serve as Utah State Deputy and the youngest State Deputy representative at the Supreme Convention. At that time, Utah had eleven councils. When I completed my term, we had thirteen.

The State now has thirty-six councils. Fr. Richard Blenner and Fr. Thomas Meersman promoted their Knights as a State Chaplin in all the State Conventions and attended state officers meetings during my tenure. They also attended many of the Supreme Conventions. It is important that the parish priests are supported by the local council. Thirty-six councils! What a wonderful growth you have accomplished

The history of the Knights in Utah was researched by Past State Deputy Frank Becker and published in book form (in 1986.)

In 1980 the Provo council 1136 spearheaded a project to place a large iron cross on the Dominguez Hill at the mouth of Spanish Fork Canyon. All councils across the state helped fund this project. With the support of the State of Utah and the efforts of the Utah National Guard helicopter team, the cross was dedicated in May of 1981. This project emphasizes what the Knights can accomplish when we work together.

Degree Teams were needed throughout the state. First, Second and Third degree teams were created by PSDs Tom O'Grady and Frank Becker. The Brigham City Council 5347 formed a third degree team which traveled throughout Utah and by requests to Idaho, Wyoming, and Nevada. The new degree teams are now encouraged to have families participate and new growth and interest will be the next step to promote our Order.

Our wives and children have in the past been our mainstay of our work in Utah. My own children have benefited from attending the Supreme Conventions and meeting children of all ages from throughout the world. This experience had opened the door to help them realize how widespread the Knights of Columbus work to promote our faith. I have been blessed to have your support to represent the Utah Knights these past sixty years and will continue to do so. I trust that your meetings to be held now for voting for the new Knights of Columbus Utah Council goes well. Good luck and God Bless.
