STATE DEPUTY'S MESSAGE

We are still practicing our faith and participating in things like stations of the cross and helping our pastors and parishes. Thank you and God bless you.

Despite the pandemic I know almost all our councils have still done something this year so please make sure to get your state award submissions in. These are due March 15th, this is a hard deadline and I will not accept a late submission. We had a virtual training in January about submitting the awards; we followed up in February with another training on how to combine PDF documents for your award submissions (along with how to use social media). I am willing to help, reach out if you need it.

Convention update: Be on the lookout for more information to come, but we have decided it will be in our best interest to hold the convention virtually. I desperately want to meet with you in person and our COVID-19 numbers are getting better, but we aren't out of the woods yet. We still have limitations on how many can meet in person and I want us all to be as safe as possible. We had two extremely successful state meetings

virtually this year and I'm confident our convention will be successful as well virtually.

Last item, we need you on the state team! If interested in running for state office, please announce your intentions to run. If you have what it takes I encourage you to run for office, any office, including State Deputy! If you would like to be a State Officer and feel you can make the Utah State Knights of Columbus better, please run for office!

2021 STATE CONVENTION REMINDERS

What do you need to know for a virtual convention?

- The convention committee (District #11) is still putting together a convention (advertising) booklet. The deadline for the advertising content and funds is **March 31**st. The form is available online (see the link above), and there are several options. Including a new **FREE** option for a Knights business directory, and a **reduced price** half-page black and white ad option for councils and assemblies!
- The usual "hospitality room" donations aren't necessary, as there won't be a hospitality room. Extra donations to the scholarship (Dollars for Scholars) and ultrasound (Shots for Tots) funds are appreciated, those go to the State Secretary (Bill Kelly).
- There are no hotel rooms to reserve, no meals to select, and no payment necessary for either.
- Letters of Intent should be out today (March 1st). There's nothing wrong with some competition, don't be shy about running for office!
- Councils do need to select and register their (two) delegates and (two) alternates. Take extra care entering the email addresses as they will be important with the virtual convention. This needs to be done weeks in advance, so the delegates can be assigned to committees (they meet in advance of the virtual convention).
- The proposed state budget should be voted on by your council in advance of the convention. State Treasurer Ryan will send it in the next two weeks.
- Councils should also vote on the resolutions submitted for the convention, so the council delegates properly represent their council. If a resolution needs to be submitted for the convention, they are due today (March 1), as the bylaws stipulate 60 days in advance of the convention.

STATE SECRETARY'S CORNER

My Brother Knights, it is hard to believe it is March already and finally last week we had our first measurable snow storm. We may be getting near to turning the corner on this pandemic as numbers are starting to decline and the COVID vaccines are slowly but surely being fielded. Continue to promote the "Leave No Neighbor Behind Program" helping out our clergy, and parishioners while keeping yourselves and your families safe so once this terrible thing is gone, we can move out and perform the great works of Christopher Columbus.

Of particular note this month was the Knights support to the Diocesan Science Fair. Many thanks go out to Joe Ligori, Ryan Gravely and the 73 knights who served as judges to make this event a great success story for this year. Several of our councils conducted drive thru breakfasts and fish fries to bring parish communities together to raise needed

funds that support Knights' causes while minimizing public contact. Please continue to meet either online or in person; new and innovative ideas are surfacing that will enable us to continue the pursuit of our good works.

The convention will soon be upon us on April 30th and May 1st. I need your help during your council meetings in March to select your primary and alternate delegates. On Feb. 13, I sent out an email to Grand Knights and Financial Secretaries that included an online Cognito form (fillable) for you to easily submit your delegates. Please get these in as soon as you can so I can form the convention committees. Another convention item is per capita. As I write this letter, there are 9 councils who have not paid their FY20-21 State per Capita. I must remind councils that per capita payment is required to be seated at the State Convention. Thanks to the 25 councils who have made payments. In addition, the State is seeking council contributions for the Christopher Fund, the Bishop's Vocations, the Bishop's Culture of Life Funds and the Scholarship Fund for our year end contributions in these areas. current contribution status is listed below. Lastly, please review State Advocate Frank Carmona's draft resolutions and provide comment or input on potential new ones.

Several administrative reports still require submission. On the Form 1728, Fraternal Survey, we currently sit at 31/34 on submissions. Thanks to those of you who got these in on time as this report is necessary for your council's eligibility for the Star Council award. On our semiannual audit report, we have 26/34 submitted. I realize that this report is more challenging than the rest as it involves number crunching. However, this report is necessary for us to stay straight with the IRS. So even if you have not submitted these reports, please get them in as soon as you can to get credit.

Now, for the monthly report on cash flows. Charitable contributions year to date are as follows: Bishop Vocation \$640; Bishop Culture of Life \$100; Military Chaplains \$200; MS Walk \$25; Native American \$2565; Scholarship \$721; Science Fair \$2730; Special Olympics \$3155; Ultrasound \$10,605; Vets Assist \$100; and Wheelchair \$100. Total contributions through end of February 2021 now exceed \$35K. Special thanks my brother knights for your untiring generosity and the activities that your councils conduct to provide support to these important charities.

SIR KNIGHTS IN THE NEW UNIFORM ARE NEEDED!

Sir Knight of the Fourth Degree, please get your new uniform! You will never know when the opportunity arises to provide a Honor Guard! We recently had one for the funeral of an amazing priest. He is the embodiment of a *Remarkable Story of Forgiveness and Healing* in a tumultuous world.

A last-minute honor guard was provided for the funeral of **Father Ubald Rugirangoga** at the Cathedral of the Madeleine in Salt Lake City, Utah. He was a missionary priest from Rwanda working out of the Diocese of Green Bay Wisconsin. While ministering in the Jackson Hole WY area when he contracted COVID in October 2020. He was transferred to the University of Utah Hospital for treatment. He continued with hospitalization for treatment of a lung disorder from which he ultimately succumbed. His life's story of Forgiveness is remarkable and a peek into it can be found in these obituary links. Recommend reading at least these. Those I have talked to, some that knew him and they positively believe he will be a saint. His remarkable autobiography is available online. I found it on Amazon. The title is "Forgiveness Makes You Free: A Dramatic Story of Healing and Reconciliation from the Heart of Rwanda".

Doing further study of Father Ubald Rugirangoga's life I obtained and read his book "FORGIVENESS MAKES YOU FREE". Here is a brief overview of his book and I heartily recommend obtaining your own copy and take the time to read and internalize his dramatic story of healing and reconciliation. My takeaway from this book was to rethink what is the Eucharist, i.e., what did I say it was as opposed to what internally I believe it is. To my surprise I had to reconcile the differences I found upon this examination.

You will find that his encounter with the baptismal education process with a blind woman which lead him to the realization that we become blind to God. Paraphrasing *"We can hide ourselves for others, but we cannot hide truth from ourselves or from God"*. After these insightful chapters on forgiveness come "HIS GIFT." Father Ubald worked for healing physical and spiritual, as one day during his healing prayers he was given the insight to realize that someone had been healed, not through him but through prayer to Jesus. Father Ubald healing services with the Blessed Sacrament Exposed in the Monstrance. He would move through the crowds holding the monstrance high and healings would take placed due to the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

Father Ubald reviews his life from his childhood, losing and finding his faith as a seminarian, becoming a priest, his pastoral role, up to the Rwandan genocide. Then comes the flight from Rwanda to Europe, healing at Fatima, with ultimate returning home to Rwanda and sharing his gifts with Rwanda, the United States and the world.

The last chapter is a Guided Meditation with Father Ubald. He provides the five spiritual keys to freedom.

"I have traveled all across the world. I have seen many souls encounter the healing touch of Christ in the Eucharist, and I have witnessed people receive spiritual and even physical healing by opening their hearts to Christ." — Father Ubald
