STATE DEPUTY'S MESSAGE

Hello brothers, as this newsletter is coming out the same day as our convention, I want to say thank you again to all those that attended, participated and supported our annual meeting. I know it has been interesting having all of the state meetings this year held virtually, but this has allowed us to keep everyone safe while still accomplishing the things we need to do.

One of my comments during my state deputy address was about how we (this includes the councils) have adapted this year and picked up some tools that we can continue to use when we go back to "normal," whatever that normal may look like. Having the ability to stream your meetings or events virtually may allow for more participation. Adding the ability to electronically collect payments, whether that be for dues or to collect donations, can assist our councils in being more financially stable or to give even more to charity. These can be great tools; if anything the challenges we have faced during the last year can make us stronger.

In a recent Gallup poll titled *U.S. Church Membership Falls Below Majority for First Time*, it stated in 2020 only 47% of the U.S. adult population belonged to a church, synagogue or mosque, and that was down 20 points just from the turn of the century. The decline is due to a couple of factors, mainly tied to an increase in lack of religious affiliation. A large reason for this, I think, is we are losing our sense of religious community and those communities need to be inviting. We, as Catholics, need to give people a reason to belong and serve our parish communities, and the Knights are in a position to provide this inviting community. We can work with our pastors and parishes to create events, to be inviting, and to give a reason for people to join, explore, and retain their faith.

As we come to the end of this fraternal year, I ask that you keep your members engaged, men are looking to be involved and to help. Supreme has just rolled out a new program called the COVID Recovery Program, and I strongly encourage every council to participate. There are no additional forms or reporting that needs to be done, but what it does is give you a road map or suggestions on how to help your parishes. Please embrace this program; meet with your pastors and find out how your council can assist them in bringing people back to church.

The COVID Recovery Program can easily be adapted to each council, as each council is unique. The basic framework has three steps for councils: 1. Meet with your Pastor. 2. Meet with your DD or State representative. 3. Engage council members in recover activities (act on your recovery plan). There are some great guides or suggested agendas for steps 1 and 2 in the CRP guide book or on Supreme's website here: www.KofC.org/CRP (click on "Council Leaders" on the menu).

We, as a state, have not gone dormant during this pandemic, and even some of our programs or our councils have thrived. Share that message with your councils. Success breeds success, and

despite all that we have faced we have been successful. But, imagine how much more successful we can be.

FRATERNAL PROGRAMS REPORT FORM (10784)

Is everyone familiar with the Form 10784 mentioned above? It's the Faith in Action Fraternal Programs Report Form and it is submitted online. Any council member can report on a program using the form. To get the link, fill in your membership number and your last name (both of which are on your membership card), and then check your email (the one supreme has on file in member management) for the link to the form. The link is good for 48-hours; if you need more time, just submit your membership number and name again for a new link.

The member submitting the program report will automatically receive a PDF copy of their submissions, as will the council's Grand Knight and Financial Secretary. It's recommended that a copy be forwarded to your District Deputy, just so he has all the details also.

Need more information on the form and its peculiarities? State Trainer Jerry Angus highlighted that in the training session on Monday March 22nd. The resources, including a link to the GoToMeeting recording on YouTube, are all on the state website training page www.UtahKnights.org/Training

SUPREME FORMS & WHERE TO FIND THEM

Looking for council forms? The easiest way to find them is to visit www.KofC.org/Forms and scroll through the list of council and check the menu for other groups forms: district forms, state forms, assembly forms for the fourth degree, as well as the Faith in Action Program Forms. The form pages have links to the PDF version and/or the online submission link for each form. When available, the online submissions are recommended, and that reminder is on the website.

Don't see a particular program form? The 10784 has replaced many individual program reporting forms, and there is a Program Form Reference Guide 11172 available to show exactly which forms are retired, and which are still needed (e.g., 2863 the RSVP refund application is still necessary).

Looking for a way to access the forms without having to remember a special website address? That's simple also. Just visit www.KofC.org and click the For Members button (top right corner). It's on a red background, so it's easy to find — unless your screen is too narrow, then it's just regular text on the hamburger menu. Then you should see the FORMS option to the right of the video, or if your screen isn't wide enough, below the video.

I will be meeting with the District Marshals in early May and review these programs. Subsequently I will touch base with the Faithful Navigators.

- Stuffed Animals are being provided by several other organizations and the first responders are flooded with these furry critters. This year we gave over 1,000 stuffed animals to Toys for Tots.
- Sock for Heroes. We were able to supply a large number of the gripper socks this year, through a supplier that charged about \$1.48 a pair with free shipping. Thousands were given to the VA around the state. What did we hear from the VA? Thank you very much but can you also supply underwear? Question! What do you want? Answer everything in all sizes. So, you will be hearing of the BVD! Program (Brother Veterans Drawers!). Don't laugh too hard, suggest a new name. A naming contest?
- The current **State Endowment Scholarship** program continues. The winner selection (for both the prize drawing and the scholarship itself) is announced at the state convention. The new 4th Degree scholarship Resolution is out for vote of approval to the 10 Utah Assemblies. Not all assemblies have submitted their vote so the District Master will be following up on this in May.
- Veterans Assistance is provided by the APSC (American Patriot Service Corp). This organization, not unlike the DAV, VFW etc. provides aid to veterans and surviving spouses help with filing claims and getting available and needed benefits. I would like to keep this program alive continue support of this organization. I am a disabled veteran and worked for 40 years to get my full benefits.

SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE — MAY 2021

"As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love. ... This is my commandment: Love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." (Gospel for May 9, Jn 15:9-10, 12-13)

Christ tells us we will remain in his love if we keep his commandments. Saying you love someone can be easy, but it is really our deeds that reveal our love — or lack of it. Christ showed us how to love by his example and by sacrificing his very life for us. To love as Christ commands us to love demands action. The Letter of James says, "Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves" (1:22). May each of us commit to keeping the commandments and offering our very selves in service and sacrifice for others.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to meditate on the meaning of the Ten Commandments in your life by picking one on 10 different days and praying about it for at least 10 minutes. 

get outdoors to do all of my spring chores. I don't know about you, but this time of

That's a lot of house payments to miss. Luckily, his disability income policy came to the rescue. It can happen to any one of us.

A 2014 CDA Long-Term Disability Claims Review had a number of notes: More than 1 in 4 of today's 20-year-olds will become disabled before they retire, 76% of us live paycheck to paycheck; less than 5% of all disabling accidents and illnesses are work related. That means 95% of those are not covered by Worker's Compensation. You're on your own 95% of the time. Turn to Social Security; but Social Security's report on SSDI says that only about 40% of applicants are awarded benefits. Couple that with 69% of the private sector workforce having no long-term disability income insurance and it's no wonder disabilities are the #1 cause of mortgage foreclosures.

So, what to do? Let's get together and find out. Do you need disability income insurance? If so, how much? Maybe you have some at work...is it enough? Is it taxable? Is it the right kind? Let me suggest you put your mind and your family's mind at ease. Life is unpredictable, pandemic or not. Let's plan for the worst...but expect the best. We can't see what the future will bring, I'm here to help you plan for the unexpected. Let's make sure that if you or your spouse are sick or hurt and can't work, that your family can stay in the home you've provided, pay the utilities, buy groceries...make sure the basics are covered.

Meanwhile, stay safe and healthy.
