First off, I want to thank everyone for the vote of confidence in re-electing me to the office of State Deputy. Jokingly I referred to myself a couple of times this past year as the Virtual State Deputy and I'm excited for next year and getting to do some of our meetings in person. With that being said, I'm happy to announce our kickoff – organizational meeting will be in person! We will be meeting on Saturday, June 26th at Blessed Sacrament Parish in Sandy. I highly encourage a representative or two from every council come. We are planning on doing the meeting and training sessions a little different, they should be more tailored to the individual roles of Grand Knights, Financial Secretaries, and District Deputies. All Knights are welcome, even if they don't fill one of those positions. I remember attending the state meetings as a general member and coming back to my council energized and excited to share some of the information and different things other councils were doing around the state.

I also want to congratulate all of the award winners for this past year. We announced the Faith In Action program winners (Faith, Family, Community, and Life) along with the Scholarship winners, and the Knight and Family of the year winners at the virtual convention. At the Organizational meeting we will be having a dinner/banquet after Mass on Saturday and will re-announce the winners and hand out the awards there. Please come and join us, we haven't been able to meet in person or share some fraternal time in a while and I think this will be great!

This year isn't over, we still have a month left and I need your help! We set some goals for the state last year and we are falling just a bit short regarding growth. So I set a new goal when the 4th quarter started, it wasn't to achieve the big membership goal but a targeted amount of new members just in the 4th quarter, it was to achieve 60 new members in the last quarter. With a little effort this is very achievable, organically we have grown without any church drives and reached 24 new members and only need 36 more.

Utah Honor Guards are back on duty as COVID restrictions are being eased. Numerous Honor guards for First Holy Communions, Confirmations and Ordination Celebrations were and are being supported.

Fourth Degree Scholarship

A Resolution to create a Fourth Degree Scholarship was circulated to the ten Assemblies in Utah. The resolution passed with the assemblies vote of 6 FOR, 3 AGAINST and 1 No Vote due to concern over the scholarship name. This scholarship is initially set to provide an annual \$1,000 award with the first award in 2022. This scholarship is to support any Sir Knight, his wife, or dependent (age 26 years or younger). Specific details setting up the governance are being established by the District Master and his committee.

Civic Award

Civic Award submissions are due by June 30th. The Civic Award can be obtained by all assemblies each year. The submission is simply asking for four (4) patriotic programs you assembly has conducted over the past year. It's only a page with four sentences or short paragraphs. <u>Civic Award Submission Form (PDF)</u> As the end of the fiscal year looms less than a month away, the Civic Award is still available to all assemblies. I recently came across this VA Wish List. In the list are a host of projects ideas to help our brother and sister vets. If you haven't fulfilled four programs yet this year, there is still time within a single month to lend a hand to our fellow veterans. While this list was generated by the Salt Lake City George Whalen Veteran Facility, the items are universal in nature. STATE SECRETARY'S CORNER

My Brother Knights, thank you for your vote of confidence to serve as your State Secretary for FY 21-22. It was great interfacing with you during the virtual state convention last month. We shared some great ideas and experiences that we accomplished during the trying COVID period. It appears that we have made the turn as fewer restrictions are in place as we go about to conduct our day-to-day business. I look forward to meeting with many of you during our kick off meeting on June 26th. Please continue to do what you do best, serving our Pastors and Parish Communities.

On May 23rd, I emailed all council GKs, DGKs, and FSs with a request to submit their SP7s (Columbian Award Applications) early and provided your council's current status for Supreme Level awards. Several have asked why submit early. Well, the first reason is to ensure your council

receives proper credit for the activities that you completed this past year. If some reason Supreme rejects your council's report we want to have time to resubmit for credit. The second reason is that Utah is in competition with the rest of the Western Region for a report timeliness award. We have done really well this year with our reporting at over 98%. Remember you only need only need 10 programs/10 credits this year [minimum of two in each category in Faith, Family, Community and Life, plus 2 others].

Many of you (20 to be exact) are in a great position to quality for either the Star Council or the McGivney Award with 1 or 2 members gains before the end of the year. Remember the answer to the old question "What is the best way to get a man to join the knights" – "ask him". Also, consider reactivating prior members who were recently suspended in the last 3-5 years and ask them to come back. By attaining Star Council, you council not only receive recognition for a job well done, but your council will receive a \$4.50 credit for each active member in your council.

In the insurance seminar area, we need 21 councils to have members participate in a virtual seminar. Gene Trombetti just notified me of a seminar presented by Tom Hegna on June 2nd at 6:30PM: "Don't Worry Retire Happy". The registration link is: <u>https://zoom.us/webinar/register/WN 1rzLU-e4Tp007on0Km0D9w</u> So please have a few members from your councils attend this seminar so you can qualify for the Founder's Award and possibly Star.

Many councils are in process of conducting council nominations and elections. When you are ready to submit next year's officer's report, please file it through Officers Online, Member Management, in Council Administration Tab. However, I must caution you to ensure that you select "Next Fraternal Year". Otherwise, you could result in overwriting this year's current council officers and use lose your safe environment credential. The easiest way to verify that you are in Next Year's tab is all the positions will be reflected as unassigned. Then to save you some time, as an added feature, use the button on the upper left "Copy Current Year". Clicking this button populates all positions based on prior report and then all you need to do is update with new names and click submit – done! Please forward Supreme's confirmation email to both State Deputy Nick and me.

In the administrative area, for the semiannual audit report (Jul—Dec 2020), we currently sit at 32/34 on council submissions. For the two councils who have not submitted, please try to complete so we can avoid trouble with the IRS. On that note, remember to submit you 990N to the IRS. If you have never done a 990 -N, please reach out to State Advocate Frank Carmona or me and we will walk you through the process.

Since the state convention, we have had some minor changes on the status of our charitable contributions. Charitable contributions year to date are as follows: Bishop Vocation \$1,830; Bishop Culture of Life \$1,620; Carmelites \$7,045; Christopher Fund: \$595; Coats for Kids: \$7,883; Military Chaplains \$725; MS Walk \$75; Native American \$2,565; Perpetual Memorial Fund \$660; Scholarship \$1,651; Science Fair \$3,100; Special Olympics \$3,430, Ultrasound \$21,666; Vets Assist \$100, and Wheelchair \$100. Total contributions through end of May 2021 now exceed \$53K. Thanks again for your outstanding support of our charitable causes during this trying year.

UTAH KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS SCHOLARSHIP

For the past 11 years I have had the privilege of serving as the state scholarship chairman. My involvement with this program began in 2008 at a meeting with PSD Dan Higgins following the annual state convention that year. PSD's Jim Leccia and John Wainscott came on board and a partnership with the Columbian Society under Council 602 and the Utah State Council was forged. The first scholarship was awarded in 2011. Our state convention held in May 2021 awarded scholarships to two new recipients, growing the number to 30 awards over the past 10 years. The Dan Higgins Memorial Scholarship was given to Elisabeth Penderghast and the Utah Knights of Columbus Scholarship was awarded to Jadelyn Flores. With these two awards, \$54,000 has been given to the winning students.

Funds for the scholarship are raised each year solely by donations from councils and assemblies around the state. In 2017 it was decided that a helping hand was needed to build the reserve fund held at the Catholic Foundation of Utah in an endowment. A raffle was created by Fr. Dominguez Assembly 1144. The raffle is not the vehicle that gives the award, but rather the vehicle that builds for the future. Tickets for the 2020-2021 raffle came in from over 40 cities from Utah, Nevada, and California. The Cedar City council and assembly working together produced the most sales for the fourth consecutive year. The winners of the raffle this year were; FIRST, Rogelio Castaneda, SECOND, Laura McAneney, and THIRD, Kenny Black.

In May 2021, another milestone in the scholarship program of Utah was reached. By a majority vote of all assemblies of the state, a Fourth Degree scholarship will be created and is anticipated to be awarded at the state convention in May 2022. Details for this program will be announced by our District Master Dick Hall. (see page 4.)

Donations remain the lifeblood the program. Both councils and assemblies have been generous in their willingness to grow this program. As we prepare to begin our new fraternal year on July 1st, please make the scholarship a regular budget item. And yes! Don't forget the raffle tickets. They will be coming in the mail after the year is underway. Many thanks to all who have been on board along the way to make the journey possible.


