STATE DEPUTY'S MESSAGE

I want to start this month's newsletter by closing out some items from the previous fraternal year. First off, I want to announce the fourth quarter and year end recruitment incentive winners. Congratulations to our winners and a huge thank you for your efforts last year:

Q4 Top Recruiter - Dennis Martinez (6010) with 4 new members - \$100

Q4 GK with most new members - Paul Buckley (15418) 225% of quota in Q4 with 9 new members - \$50

Q4 Top DD – Mark Dylla District 10 with 500% of quarterly goal - \$50

Q4 Top Council (recruitment, safe environment, and forms) - St Ambrose Council 15418 - \$100

Year-end Council with highest % of online members – St Olaf Council 5502 - \$250 Per Capita credit Year-end Top Recruiter – Gene Trombetti (1129) with 9 new members - \$200

Next up, I want to explain what the state did with the money received last year that wasn't used. Ordinarily the state has a very tight budget but due to the pandemic we were unable to do a lot of the things that were planned. I made the decision to give the money back to the councils that was unused in the form of a Per Capita credit. We calculated how many active members we had in the state and were able to give you back \$3.50 per active member you are billed. This resulted in a 30% reduction to your council's state per capita this fraternal year. Unlike Supreme, the state per capita provides the only income we have for operating but given the pandemic and inability to hold activities last year I wanted to make sure we assisted the councils and helped get off to a great start this year. By now you should have received your Per Capita invoice from our State Secretary showing this credit. Any questions please let me know.

The heat of the summer months is in FULL SWING but hopefully that doesn't stop your councils from being active. I'm excited to report I was able to participate in the Foursomes for Fisher House golf tournament sponsored by Council 12181 and Assembly 2577. I participated in the charity trap shoot sponsored by Council 7401 in Vernal and had an absolute BLAST! See what I did there, "full swing" followed by golf and trap shoot followed by "blast" – maybe I should leave the jokes to the professionals.

I am very excited to be participating in the Council 14399 golf tournament coming up on August 10th and I heard Council 11426 in Cedar City has started doing movie nights. This is awesome! We don't stop having Mass during the summer and our parishes and communities need the Knights – so why would we take the summer off? If your council is doing an activity, please let the state know so we can help promote it and I

want to attend if possible. If your council doesn't have anything planned, ask why and what you can do. Get started on the COVID Recovery Program [www.KofC.org/CRP] and help your parishes by sponsoring an activity. Also, those activities are a great way to engage your membership and recruit new men that have been longing for something to do over the past year and half.

As I mentioned at the Organizational meeting, I want us to improve on last year. We had 11 new members last July but only 4 this year. I need your help if we are going to improve. I look forward to this month and seeing what you can do. Thank you and Vivat Jesus!

A Higher Purpose

Encourage youth to become citizens grounded in their faith through creative writing. Open to all qualifying Catholic students.

Overview

This contest encourages today's youth to be more connected to their community and their faith. The goal of this program is to involve young Catholics in grades 8 to 12 (public, private, parochial or home schools during the current school year) in civic discourse and instill in them religious and life-affirming values.

In an essay of 500-750 words, describe everyday obstacles that you may have experienced or witnessed others experiencing while living a life of authentic faith. Explain how you have overcome these obstacles and how, by doing so, it has helped your faith to continue to grow.

Entrants will be judged on grammar, style, and how clearly they present the theme in a way that showcases creativity, imagination and overall development of the topic.

Overview

Conducting a Knights of Columbus Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest is a fun and easy way to put your faith into action and get youth in your community involved in their faith. It is fun to conduct because of the opportunity to witness the creativity and optimism of the youth in your community. It is easy because you can tap into existing structures like schools and do a lot of preliminary work. It can also provide excellent local, and potentially international, publicity for your Council.

The Knights of Columbus Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest is open to all youth between the ages of 5 and 14. Age eligibly is determined by the age of the contestant as of November 1.

Contest entrants compete in one of three age groups — ages 5 through 7, ages 8 through 10 and 11 through 14. Each local, district, regional or jurisdictional competition may have up to 9 winning entries — a first, second, and third place winner in each age group. Posters are due to the Council on December 15.

Entrants will be judged on Slogan – How clearly is the theme presented; Visuals – How well do the visuals convey the message; and Overall Impact – How effective was the poster in capturing your attention and causing you to reflect on the topic.

STATE SECRETARY'S CORNER

My Brother Knights, here we are in August already where one month of our new fraternal year has passed so quickly. It is good to see that councils are meeting in person again and starting to have events in their Parishes. I attended four council meetings in July and was truly amazed at the energy level among our brother knights to get back out there and revitalize our program efforts across our State.

I would like to congratulate our 17 new GKs and DGKs for FY21-22. Thanks for stepping up to the challenge to lead your councils and continue the great works of your predecessors to support the works of our Founder, Blessed Michael McGivney. A special thank you to those councils and assemblies who have submitted their officer reports. We still have a few more (9) outstanding so please send those into Supreme as soon as you can and provide me a copy so I can complete

the state directory sooner than later. Speaking of which, I sent our leaders and chairmen draft one of the state directory on July 23rd. Please review and provide me with any updates, changes or corrections. I need your help to ensure the information contained within is accurate. If for some reason you did not receive a copy, please email or call me and I will send you the latest draft version.

On July 16th, I sent out the FY21-22 State Per Capita invoices. You will note that the state applied a credit to your per capita of \$3.50 per active member in your council as of April 1st. This credit was based on unused funds from FY20-21 for unexecuted activities and programs based on the COVID-19 Pandemic. Thanks to the 6 councils who already have sent me their payment already.

The Service Personnel Program Report is past due! I need some help in this area. Based on Supremes' report from July 22nd, there are 25 councils who have not submitted this report. Although this report lists 14 positions, only 5 directors are required (Program (PD), Community (CD), Family (FD), Membership, and Retention) to acquire credit for submission. Please file this report online using the council administration tab in Member Management. This will save you a lot of time by pointing, clicking, selecting and submitting with your mouse as opposed to typing in the old form.

Most of you are aware that the service personnel report directly impacts your council's safe environment credentialing for the upcoming FY. Please ensure before you appoint your program, community and family directors that they are willing to complete the safe environment training and have a local records (background) check performed on them. The training and background check must be completed **within 30 days of appointment** or unfortunately you will need to resubmit the report to reappoint them.

The next administrative report that will be coming due is your council audit report, due on August 15th. Assembly audits are due today (August 1st). We did very well on these last year getting several councils caught up on past filings. So besides some number crunching don't forget you need to acquire four signatures on the form before submitting. Thanks to the four councils who already submitted this report.

Lastly, as you finalize your budgets for this year don't forget to set aside some funds for the Christopher, Bishop's Vocations and Culture of Life, Military Vocations and State Scholarship funds.* A sincere thank you to all of you who made fund contributions in the last two years during the trying COVID period.

MEMBERSHIP

"There is always strength in numbers. The more individuals that you can rally to your cause, the better." Let's talk about numbers. The DDs and GKs have all received their membership targets for 2021-2022. Let's look at those numbers in a different way. The State needs about 180 new members this year. That means 15 new members a month, or 45 new members a quarter. We have 11 Districts, so that means 4 new members per District per quarter (or a little more than 1 per month). With 37 Councils, we need a little more than 1 new member per quarter. The secret for each GK and DD is not to worry about the total target, but just get one new member, then worry about getting the next, and so on.

There are resources available from Supreme and the State to recruit new members, but the best recruitment is your own Council. Let the men of your parish know what your council is planning to do this year. Ask your priest and deacons how the council can help them this year. Have a Church Drive [suggested timeline] or ask your priest to talk about the Knights from the pulpit. Advertise the Knights at every opportunity.

Many of you have probably spoken to a parishioner that was not interested in the Knights or would consider it when he is older. If the former does not see the value in what you do, ask him for his help in how he would like to see the Knights change. For the latter, now he is older; ask him again. Remember, every council activity is a membership opportunity.

Encourage those members who hold the old First or Second Degree to take the Unified Degree of Charity, Unity and Fraternity, and then encourage their membership in the Patriotic Degree. Even our District Master has a target number to achieve.
