Utah State Update

I WILL DEMONSTRATE MY FAITH TO YOU FROM MY WORKS.

Brothers we have made it through the first quarter of the year, and I hope you are doing well. Last month I suggested checking in with your councils to see if you were on track to achieve your goals. It is never too late and always a good idea to set goals if you haven't and review them if you have so you'll know what needs to be done.

What are your council's goals? Having specific and measurable goals will make it easy to track. Membership growth of 5%, two fraternal benefit/insurance events, submitting the necessary paperwork (Forms 185, 365, 1295, 1728), being safe environment compliant; these are all specific and measurable and are great starting points to set your goals and easy to review. When I refer to goals I'm not just talking about membership and forms, yes they should be part of them, but they aren't the only thing I am talking about.

I love the second reading from a couple of weeks ago from James 2:14-18 and I think this is one of the main reasons I'm a Knight and I hope you see the value in me sharing this with you and will apply it. The reading starts off with a question: "What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says he has faith but does not have works?" The reading ends with the statement "I will demonstrate my faith to you from my works." I know we all have faith, let's face it, you wouldn't be a part of a Catholic Fraternal Organization if you didn't. But are we practicing our faith? I think we are, and we can always do more. How are your councils and the Knights demonstrating our faith? Make your works part of your goals. Whether that is the act of recruiting and essentially evangelizing by recruiting men, doing a community event to get people to come church, or by fundraising and giving that money away.

A simple breakfast or donut bar, helping a community member with yard work, an event like a golf tournament or a parish yard sale to me are all ways we can demonstrate our faith. They may not seem like it, but so many good things can come from these events. Thank you for all you do and will do this year. If you aren't doing these things, it isn't too late to plan and execute those plans. Make them part of your goals and make sure you are on track to achieve them.

Speaking of works, the **Coats for Kids** season is upon us and I'm very proud of the pledges and distributions you have set around the state! On Monday, 9/27, we received the approval from supreme for the matching cases of coats. We will distribute almost triple the coats we did last year. **Thank you.**

I want to recognize and thank the councils and members that are recruiting, in September we brought more new members than July and August combined! We are still a little behind from where we need to be, but this is a great end to the first quarter and I'm excited to see what we can do next quarter. Council 12181 brought

in 3 new members into their council. Councils 602, 5347, and 10733 each brought in 1 new member; and we have several new online members waiting to be transferred in from councils 5502, 6010, 6739, 6966, 7401, 9849, 10733, 12181 (all joined in September).

The **Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest** is a **Faith in Action - Community Program**. It encourages youth to become citizens grounded in their faith through creative writing and is open to all qualifying Catholic students. This contest encourages today's youth to be more connected to their community and their faith. The goal of this program is to involve young Catholics in grades 8 to 12 (public, private, parochial or home schools during the current school year) in civic discourse and instill in them religious and life-affirming values.

In an essay of 500-750 words, describe everyday obstacles that you may have experienced or witnessed others experiencing while living a life of authentic faith. Explain how you have overcome these obstacles and how, by doing so, it has helped your faith to continue to grow.

Contest entrants compete in each Grade. Each Council, district, regional or jurisdictional competition may have up to 15 winning entries — a first, second, and third place winner in each Grade. Entrants will be judged on grammar, style, and how clearly they present the theme in a way that showcases creativity, imagination and overall development of the topic. Essays are due to the Council on November 30. Entry Form #4208.

Brother Knights,

The past week has been a busy one for Life activities in the SLC valley. The kick-off rally for the Fall **40 Days for Life** campaign was held on Sept. 21 in front of the downtown Planned Parenthood clinic. We had 18- 20 attendees, including Deacon Greg Werking, who led us in prayer, and a Rosary. There were <u>three Knights</u> in attendance. Volunteers are always needed. Please go to <u>www.40daysforlife.com/en/saltlakecity</u> to sign up for a shift.

On Saturday, Sept. 25th **America Needs Fatima** (ANF) held a **Rosary Rally of Reparation** in front of the Utah State Capitol. This was a counter to the Utah Satanic Temple rally, which was there to promote its Religious Reproductive Rights agenda. Roughly 30 attended, including <u>four Knights</u>. The ANF rosary was followed by a counter rally hosted by <u>UtahPatriots.com</u> and Pro-Life Utah. Approximately 70-80 people attended as compared to some 250-300 Satanists—men, women, and children all decked in black, horns, Satanic logos, complete with horses, and chants of "Hail Satan." They are real and there are more of them than you think. Do not underestimate the power of the dark side. It was a strange experience, to say the least.

On Sunday, September 26th, Council 12181 and the Saint John the Baptist [Parish] Respect Life Ministry hosted the annual **Life Chain** in Sandy. We had our largest turnout to date with over 70 participants, (including <u>10 Knights</u>), of all ages and faiths. We even had a pro-choice man attend who I spent a fair amount of time talking with. In the end, he stood with us holding a sign as a witness to life. Hearts and minds are changed one at a time at these events.

Brothers, if you think the battle is not real you need to come out and attend these events. The culture and makeup of Utah are rapidly changing. If we do not stand up and defend a culture of life, our faith, freedom, decency, morality, etc., they will all quickly be lost.

I won't sugar coat it; pancake breakfasts and spaghetti dinners have their place, and they are fun. Standing on a sidewalk defending life and getting screamed at – not so much. But it is work that needs to be done and you will find no better people to be around than fellow Life supporters. There is great energy and joy! We have roughly 3,000 Knights in Utah. On average, 3-6 Knights attend these events, often the same ones. We are woefully underrepresented. We must do better. We CAN do better!

Moving on, **October is National Respect for Life Month**! Please check the Diocesan website <u>www.dioslc.org/respect-for-life/events-2021</u> for all upcoming Life events. Please work with your parish priest to schedule at least one Life event in October.

Finally, the **Utah March for Life** is scheduled for **January 22, 2022**. Please mark your calendars and plan to attend. Details to come.

MEMBERSHIP DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

This year, more than ever, we need to stress Family and Faith. Have you spoken to your pastor about how your Council can help him reach out to those parishioners who are still reluctant to return to Mass? Have you set up programs and activities?

Knights need Programs... Programs need Knights. At every activity have flyers, pamphlets, and cards available for new members to sign up online. Let everyone in your parish know what your Council is all about and what the Council is going to do. Ask for new members to assist you in your programs. Last month I sent samples of the flyers, pamphlets, and cards that your Council could use to the District Deputies. Enlist their help if you have not already done so.

Some Councils have made use of Delta Church Drives. Others have had open houses to discuss the Knights. This week I heard of three Sir Knights that were talking to parishioners at various activities. They asked the parishioner if they were Knights. The answer from five men were – you guessed it – "No. Nobody ever asked me." Four of these men have now joined online.

How do you get new members: First, help members develop an "elevator speech" about their membership. Why are they members? What's the biggest benefit of membership? Can they explain the purpose of the Knights of Columbus? Second, ask your members for recruitment ideas. They may have an idea you haven't thought of before, or know about opportunities within their own social networks.

Your Council needs to be visible. Several successful Councils have started to wear specific colored shirts, vest, jackets, or even aprons. Brothers wear them around town, but especially at Mass and at programs. You can find several resources for these items. Encourage your members to order the items your Council selects. In unity there is strength.

Congratulations to Council 5347 in Brigham City for leading the 1st Quarter BBQ Challenge. Eight other councils (602, 7961, 9849, 10733, 11479, 12181, 14399, and 15418) are off to a great start in increasing membership. At least two District Deputies will receive the Supreme 1st Quarter Challenge. There are currently 33 online members that are interested in transferring to a Council, including nine from this month in six Councils (four of whom currently show no new members this year). Get these online members to a degree presentation and transferred to your Council.

Check your membership roll. Have all First and Second Degree members attend a Combined Degree so they can advance to the Third Degree? Invite all Third Degree members to the Patriotic Degree Exemplification on November 6th at St. Francis Xavier in Kearns.

COATS FOR KIDS

Amazing Response! An astounding nineteen (19) councils and one Assembly (working with another three councils) have pledged over \$16,500 for Coats for Kids this year! *It's not too late to pledge and donate!* Some councils are doing their own distributions—602 at the Cathedral in SLC, 5214 in Kearns, 6010 in Layton, 9849 & 14399 are working together with Catholic Community Services (CCS) of Northern Utah in Ogden, 16127 at Hill Air Force Base, and Assembly 1146 in Utah County (Councils 1136, 8606, & 9561). All together, that's 92 cases with the case-for-case match of coats from supreme; 1104 coats for kids!

With Supreme's matching coats, we have forty (40) cases of coats to distribute as the State Council (hint: you're invited). With 12 coats in each case, that's 480 coats to give away. Distributions are set for 11/7 at Saint Andrew in Riverton (Council 14239), and 11/20 at Catholic Community Services in SLC. Other locations are still being finalized.
