

CONSECRATION TO ST. JOSEPH



Arizona Knights of Columbus is one of a few, if not the only, state to sponsor an annual Rosary celebration each October, honoring Mary under one of her many titles.

"Our Mother of Sorrows" was chosen for this year's 46th annual designation, held in Tucson as well as Phoenix. #9597 Honor Guard at Tucson's St. Augustine Cathedral and #3182 Matachines, dedicated to Mary under her title "Our Lady of Guadalupe," performed in Tucson as well as Phoenix in traditional dress.





In Phoenix, Sir Knights from Msgr. Bernard G. Collins Assembly 2889 provided a guard and escort for the Blessed Sacrament and Sir Knights from Fr. Stephen Adrian Assembly 2736 provided the Color Guard.





The Phoenix Rosary Celebration is held at the Phoenix Civic Center, downtown. The Rosary Celebration consists of The Bishop's procession, with altar servers, priests and religious from throughout the diocese. Then, a Blessing procession featuring parish prayer groups, service groups, Knight of Columbus Councils and Assemblies





There is a featured speaker, followed by the Rosary, followed by Benediction. The chairman for the Arizona Rosary Celebration is Former Supreme Master Larry Costanzo.

This is also a month to consider service to others. As always, Service to your Parish. Service to help Veterans and finally, Service to others less fortunate. We all need to be thankful for our health, families, and our life. This is a perfect month to consider Service to others.

For October, there was the John H. Reddin Provincial Meeting. It was held in Salt Lake City in the Utah District. Worthy Vice Supreme Master (WVSM) Richard Espinosa hosted the event. The four districts of Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico, and Utah were well represented. For New Mexico, our Worthy State Secretary, Bernard Ela, represented the NMSC well. WVSM passed information from the Supreme Assembly meeting held in September. The biggest takeaway was the breakdown in age of the average 4th Degree member. As an overall 4th Degree, we have a little over 35, 000 Sir Knights less that the age of 45. There are over 334,600 Sir Knights that are over 45 with a little over 203,000 that are 65 and over. So this brings the average age of our 4th Degree to 65 years of age. As much as all our dedicated Knights support, we do have to remember our perpetual watchword "Tempus Fugit, Memento Mori." If we as a 4th Degree do not help recruit for the Council and Assembly, we will age ourselves out and not have a 4th Degree left. I can only humbly ask for everyone's help with inviting all new Brother Knights and Brother Knights that have been with the Councils to the 4th Degree! Other, business mentioned was New Assembly Development. Please keep up the presence of the 4th Degree so we can support the growth of the Councils and our Assemblies.

We also had our first Exemplification of the Fraternal year. Thank you to Worthy Faithful Navigator and Assembly 683 in Las Vegas for hosting. There were 10 new Sir Knights Exemplified! Welcome to the 4th Degree. I also want to thank our Worthy State Deputy Daniel Vigil, our District Marshals Ed Martinez, Chuck Dubois and Rudy Archibeque and our Degree team of, Jim McCabe, Geoff Bacon, Ron Meyer, John Alvarado, Raul Chavez, Frank Melo and David Martinez for taking the time and effort in being able to be present and support this event!

As mentioned last month, the Supreme Master has asked again for help with supporting Seminarians of the Archdiocese of Military Service. There are three Active-duty military bases in the State of New Mexico with multiple military bases in Arizona, Colorado, Oklahoma, Texas, and Utah. Some of these bases barely have a Catholic Chaplain (Priest) present to support the military assigned to all these bases. Unfortunately, Deacons are not able to support this need either. I am working a proposal to the State Deputy and State Council to humbly request each Council and Assembly donate at least \$50 to compile and send to our Worthy Supreme Master. There will be more information out very soon.

Upcoming, events are; New Mexico State Mid-Year Meeting, Dec 4-5, Albuquerque, Advent events in our Parishes, Our Lady of Guadalupe Is Sunday December 12th. Consider having a Corporate Communion, Christmas events in the Parishes. Start preparing to support January March for Life Events, especially the beginning of the Legislative session in Santa Fe. Additionally, Martin Luther King Holiday. Finally, the next Exemplification will be January 22, 2022! Start preparing candidates for this degree! Let's make this a great 4th Degree Exemplification!

If your Assembly has not met, please meet. If you are having trouble meeting for whatever reason, please get with me or one of our District Marshals to assist your Assembly in meeting and promoting the good works of the Knights. Additionally, if your Assembly has not completed its Report for New Officers Chosen for 2021 or Audit, please do so as soon as possible. These are required forms to keep the Assembly in Good Status with the Supreme Council and keep its IRS EIN intact.

Lastly, if you have not heard, we are raffling off a uniform and sword package for \$10. If any Knight is interested, please ask the District Marshals, or Assemblies, if they are selling, to get tickets. The raffle goes until the Mid-Year Meeting that will be held in December. Lisa and I, as well as Vice Supreme Master Richard Espinosa and his bride, Janice, were invested by Daniel Cardinal Di Nardo (Galveston-Houston) into the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem last month. It's a wonderful group to be a part of—I know it's a gross understatement. For those who are curious here's a little bit of information that we recently learned about the Order:

- It's origin date back to the First Crusade over 900 years ago to defend the Holy Sepulchre (Jesus' crucifixion and burial site) and the other Holy Places so Christians can safely make pilgrimages
- Today, the purpose is to help maintain the Christian presence in the Holy Land, where Christians only make up 2% of the population. We put our faith into action by supporting churches, schools, hospitals that not only help Catholics but Jews and Muslims as well. Working, helping, and playing side-by-side with all three major religions is a good model in achieving peace in the Holy Land
- There are about 30,000 members world-wide. Candidates to the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem must be approved by their local pastor and bishop and then by the Vatican





Although I would encourage everyone to make a pilgrimage to the Holy Land, as Knights of Columbus we don't have to go to the Holy Land to put our Faith into Action. We could do it right here and right now in our own domestic churches within our families, our local parishes, our communities, and our work places.

SK Mitchell M. Marquez was born in Las Vegas, NM in 1957, he is a graduate of Robertson High School, Luna Community College, and has held the position of Purchasing Agent for the City of Las Vegas.

He attained his First Degree in 1984 and has been a lifelong member of Las Vegas Council # 804. SK Mitchell has held Offices of Grand Knight, Deputy Grand Knight, Financial Secretary, Chancellor, Advocate, Trustee, State Columbian Squires Chairman, District Deputy #2, Insurance Field Agent, Sir Knight of the Year 2010, and Sir Knight of the Month. He is a member of Supreme VIP Club, Publisher of the SIR KNIGHT BULLETIN, was a member of the First- and Second-Degree Team, and a member of Immaculate Conception church.

Since his Exemplification into the Fourth Degree in Albuquerque, NM on October 22, 1989, SK Mitchell played a key role by contributing his willingness to spend time and effort in researching evidence of the original Assembly Charter dated October 1947. After proof of documentation was submitted in 2004, reinstatement was approved with the original name and number: St. Pius X Assembly No. 683, Las Vegas NM. Thereafter, as evident by his accomplishments, Worthy Sir Knight Mitchell remains Faithful Comptroller of 17 years and continues to be a valuable asset to the Knights of Columbus Order. The miracle of life is seen through Ultrasound images. The Ultrasound initiative of the Knights of Columbus started in 2009 since then donating over 1,000 machines that have saved the lives of over a million unborn babies. Evidence shows that an expectant mother has changed her mind about abortion after viewing first-time images.

The Pregnancy Resource Center in Clovis, NM in 2020 "experienced 559 client visits with 185 new clients. 152 pregnancy tests of which 137 were positive. Over 83% of those 152 pregnant women chose life for their unborn babies. Also performed 146 life-affirming ultrasounds. The center acknowledges every human life begins at conception and is worthy of protection."

During the early stages of the above initiative, council 4205, Clovis NM supported the Pregnancy Resource Center by purchasing and donating an ultrasound machine with the aid of the Knights of Columbus Supreme council. Thank you, council 4205, Brothers all with Blessings, for your generous contribution in helping to protect all unborn life.

On October 21, 2021, eastern NM Sir Knights, brother Knights from Assembly 1686, Councils 9504, 8304, and 4205 attended and contributed to the Pregnancy Resource Center's 13th Annual Fundraising Banquet in Clovis, NM.



Celebrate the Year of St. Joseph






