STATE SECRETARY'S CORNER



My Brother Knights, I hope all of you, your families and friends had a Happy Thanksgiving. Hopefully, you were able to spend some quality time with your loved ones.

I first would like to take the opportunity to express my gratitude for those knights and councils who contributed and physically helped out with the Coats for Kids distributions. We had good turnouts at Saint Andrew (Riverton), Our Lady of Lourdes, (Magna), Saint Rose of Lima (Layton), Catholic Community Services (downtown SLC) and Saint Patrick (SLC). Many coats were given out and the families and kids were very appreciative of our efforts. There are still several distributions happening in December, so check the state website for details if you would like to help out. In addition, in November I had the opportunity to attend six council meetings and two exemplifications of

Charity, Unity and Fraternity (CUF ceremonials). It was great to get out and see several of you in person as we try to come out of this COVID period.

In the administration area, we are almost there with the Program Personnel Report, we only need 2 more: 32/34 = 94.1%. However, we still have work to be done on the January—June 2021 audits. As of the November report we are missing 12 audits, 22/34 = 64.7% submitted.

We need some help with Safe Environment credentialling. We sit at 14 councils who need to reassign directors. Program (PD), Community (CD), Family (FD) Directors are required to meet home office requirements in this area. If four positions are not listed on your safe environment report, you will need to reappoint them. Remember the PD, CD, and FD cannot be shared by the same knight. If you try to input online, the system will not accept and if you submit manually, Supreme will not process. After appointing directors, please encourage them to take the required training. If they fail to complete within 60 days, Supreme will drop them from their appointment.

As I mentioned above several coat distributions have occurred, but I have seven pledges outstanding. I would sincerely appreciate it if the pledges could be paid in full before the end of December. Financial Secretaries (FSs) should be preparing for their annual invoices for dues in the next couple of weeks. If any FSs need help with the billing/invoice system give me a call and I will try to walk you through it.

Lastly, here are the updated contributions numbers as of November 20th: Culture of Life \$306; Scholarship \$224; Vocations \$49; Carmelites \$1,088; Coats for Kids \$11,056 (of over \$16,500 pledged); Memorial Fund \$20; Navajo Strong \$50; Science Fair \$60; Special Olympics \$2,030; Vets Assistance \$165 and Ultrasound Program \$30. Thank you so much for your continued generosity.

Here is to wishing you and your families a very Blessed Christmas and a Happy 2022. I look forward to seeing many of you on January 8th at the Midyear Meeting at Saint Olaf in Bountiful.

John went throughout the whole region of the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah: "A voice of one crying out in the desert: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." (Gospel for Dec. 5, Lk 3:3-4) The preaching of John the Baptist reminds us what Advent is all about: turning away from sin and preparing for the coming of the Lord. It's all too easy to get sidetracked or distracted by Christmas shopping and parties and fail to prepare spiritually for Christ's coming. My brothers, let us truly prepare our hearts this Advent — and help our families do the same — so that we might fully and fruitfully celebrate Christ's birth.

CHALLENGE: First, prayerfully incorporate both an Advent calendar and Advent wreath into your Christmas preparations. Second, undertake the <u>Keep Christ in</u> <u>Christmas Faith In Action Program</u>.

Brothers,

Most Councils have activities scheduled this month. Before you consider HOW to recruit, you must address the question of WHOM to recruit. There are many eligible Catholic men and their families who would enjoy participating in the Order. Identifying them is easier than you think.

- Approach pastors for parish rosters of potential Knights.
- Add all local priests and deacons, who are not Knights, to prospect list.
- Consider ushers, parish council members, choir, lectors, etc., as prospects.
- Welcome all new parishioners by asking them to join.
- Consider all vendors who serve the council as potential members.
- Add fathers, sons, nephews, cousins, brothers-in-law, fathers-in-law, grandfathers, grandsons.
- Advertise regularly in church bulletins, inviting interested prospects to contact the membership committee about joining.
- Contact former members.
- Use your imagination. New members are all around you.

Last month, the Grand Knights and District Deputies received a script for a Priest to invite men to join the Knights and two samples of brochures that could be altered to be specific to your Council. Invite prospects to your activities. Hand out a brochure to any prospect. Every Council should add at least one new member this month.

Keep contact with assigned online members. Invite them to Council meetings and activities. Approve them for membership. Have them take the ceremonial online or schedule an in person CUF Degree, and transfer them into your Council.

CATHOLIC CITIZENSHIP ESSAY CONTEST

The Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest to encourage today's youth to be more connected to their community and their faith ends with *submissions to the Council on November 30*. The goal of this program is to involve young Catholics in 8th through 12th grade (public, private, parochial or home schools) in civic discourse and instill in them religious and life affirming values. Entrants will be judged on grammar, style, and how clearly they present the theme – which should showcase creativity, imagination and overall development of the topic. This contest encourages today's youth to be more connected to their community and their faith. Entries are due to the Council by November 30. This year's essay assignment is:

In an essay of 500-750 words, describe everyday obstacles that you may have experienced or witnessed others experiencing while living a life of authentic faith. Explain how you have overcome these obstacles and how, by doing so, it has helped your faith to continue to grow.

The Council needs to send up to five winning essays (one for each grade) *to their District Deputy by December 20*. Grand Knights please email me with the numbers of essays you received by grade. I need to receive up to five essays from each District (one in each grade) by January 8 so the State can judge Utah winning essays and submit them to Supreme by January 31.

JUDGING: Judges (three or more) will be selected by the sponsoring Knights of Columbus Council. Council members, their spouses, teachers, clergy, civil officials and/or members of the community may serve as judges. Essays will be judged on a 100-point scoring system:

- 35 points: Content How clearly is the theme presented?
- 30 points: Grammar Does the essay reflect proper sentence and paragraph structure and utilize correct spelling?
- 35 points: Style Does the essay show creativity, imagination and development of the topic in a compelling style?

All scores should be recorded on the entry form/score sheet $(\underline{#4208})$.

- 1. Did your Council participate? (Even if you had no entries, if you offered the program through Parish Bulletin, poster, or attempted to get another group involved, then your Council participated).
- 2. How many entries did you receive by grade?
- 3. Let me know what school, CCD, or youth group was involved.
- 4. If your Council advertised or encouraged your youths to participate and did not receive any submissions, please email and let me know what your Council did.




