We had several highlights that I thought went very well, for me my favorite parts were obviously the camaraderie and being together but I also thoroughly enjoyed the panel discussion with the representatives from 9849, 12181, and 5502. These were only a few of the councils that have been successful this year and it was amazing to hear what they were doing and having them share their best practices. I particularly liked hearing how they have been reaching out to their members, what they've been doing to be active in their communities, and how they haven't let the pandemic slow them down. Some of the other feedback was how well the program/membership fair went, going around to the different tables and being able to talk one on one. If there was something you took away that you thought was impactful, helpful, or even a suggestion for improvement the state officers would love to hear your thoughts. Also, I want to give a big thank you to the host council 5502 for their hospitality; the breakfast quiche and cheesesteak sandwiches were also another part of my favorites for the day. I'm looking forward to our statewide recruitment weekend, hopefully you are busy with plans for that during February 26th and 27th. The endorsement letter from Bishop Solis inviting men to join the Knights can be found on our website (at the midyear link above) or by clicking here (English, Spanish). Share this letter with your pastors, with your parishes, and help men become part of our organization.

The 2022 Utah March for Life was an amazing event, the Knights were recognized along with our very own John Wainscott and it was very moving. It was also very successful in bringing in new members, our intent wasn't a recruitment drive, but we were ready to discuss the Knights and invite men in. As a result, we recruited six new online members that day, I personally recruited four of those just by having a conversation about what we do and then simply asking them if they would like to join. My point to this is to not be afraid to ask a man to join, especially at one of your events. They are obviously there and interested in what you do just by attending the event, might as well ask.

In January we recruited 14 new members, only one short of our monthly goal and we are at 50% of our overall goal for the year. This is the first time in over 5 years that we've been at 50% in January, keep up the

amazing work. We are at about 83% of where we should be at for the time of year, but I'm excited to see what you can do with the statewide recruitment drive and the endorsement from the Bishop.

Lastly, now is the time to start thinking about what programs you will submit for your councils for the state awards, the submission deadline is March 15th (which is only a month and a half away). If there is anything I can do to help support you please reach out and ask.


# CATHOLIC CITIZENSHIP ESSAY CONTEST & KEEP CHRIST IN CHRISTMAS POSTER CONTEST

#### FAMILY OF THE MONTH

Each month the calendar on the right has the reminder to submit your council's Family of the Month nominee to Supreme using Form 10784. The submission by the 15th of each month is for the previous month's nominee. So, in February (by the 15th), you submit your January 2022 nominee. Program details are online at <a href="www.KofC.org/FamilyOfTheMonth">www.KofC.org/FamilyOfTheMonth</a> Of the submissions received by the deadline each month, a family is selected randomly to receive a Holy Family Icon from Supreme. They ship it out to the family's address you provided on the **Fraternal Programs Report Form** (# 10784). Regional Growth Director Ray Lopez reviewed the form at the Midyear Meeting in January.

For June—December 2021, Supremes' records only show nine (9) submissions from five (5) councils: 1136 (Orem x2), 5502 (Bountiful x1), 6739 (Tooele x1), 12181 (Draper x3), and 13297 (Holladay x2). Strangely enough, their report showed no winner in July (yet two submissions), and no Utah submissions for October, November and December! As for the random Holy Family Icon winners, in June, **Luke Mericer** from Council 12181 was selected; in August the winner was **Art Grant** of Council 13297; and in September it was **Nick Schaible** of Council 12181. Only having three (3) councils submit in a month, the odds are very favorable of being randomly selected. They're still pretty reasonable if all 37 councils submitted! Have questions? Need help? #### STATE SECRETARY'S CORNER

My Brother Knights, I hope all of you, your families and friends are being safe with this recent COVID variant spike. Fortunately, we were able this past month to have our Midyear Meeting. I was glad to see many of you, and for those who participated on line, thanks for your continued support. We have some key activities coming up in the next two months:

FEB 5th – <u>Science Fair</u> (at JDCHS, Draper),
FEB 12th – <u>4th Degree Exemplification</u> (Bountiful),
MAR 12th - <u>Saint Patrick's Day Parade</u> (Salt Lake City),
MAR 20th – State <u>Free Throw Championship</u> (Sandy).
So please try to come out and support these events if you can.

This past month, I only attended two council meetings as I focused on helping councils with administrative actions. Thank you for those

councils who participated in **Affiliate Membership Program**. As of January 30, 2022, 21 of our 34 active councils participated in the pilot program. In my conversation with Fraternal Services, this program or a very similar type program will replace the old suspension process. It is anticipated that the final version of this program will roll out later this year.

In the administration area, this past month we finally attained 100% on Council Program Personnel Service Reports. Now that everyone, has these reports in, we need some help with having council directors complete their safe environment training. For the 1728 (**Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity**), we sit at 17 of 34 councils and 4 of 10 assemblies as of January 30th. Reminder to councils, your semiannual audit for the period July to December 2021 will be due in a couple weeks on Feb. 15th.

The State Convention will soon be upon us, only three months out, May 6th—8th, so save those dates. I would to remind councils to consider year end contributions to the Christopher, Vocations, Culture of Life, Military Vocations and Scholarship Endowment Funds. I will resend the letter in the next week, that specifies the purpose of these funds and suggested contribution amounts.

I still need some help on funds that are due to the State, I have two councils that owe for pledges on our Coats for Kids project and seven councils who owe pledges for the upcoming Science Fair. In addition, there are seven councils who still owe on their State Per Capita. Remember to send these checks (payable to "Knights of Columbus Utah State Council") to the State Secretary (my address is below).

As of the end of January 2022, the State has processed receipts of \$48,986 with disbursements of \$34,891. Year to date contributions exceed \$25K broken down as follows: Culture of Life \$1060; Scholarship \$255; Vocations \$92; Carmelites \$1,386; Coats \$16,924; Memorial Fund \$20; Navajo Strong \$50; KS Tornado Fund \$50; Science Fair \$1630; Special Olympics \$3,211; Veterans Assistance \$251 and Ultrasound Program \$96.00. Again, thanks for your continued generosity.

#### SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE — FEBRUARY 2022

When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." For astonishment at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him, and likewise James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners of Simon. Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." (Gospel for Feb. 6, Lk 5:8-10) Simon Peter recognizes Jesus for who he is and deems himself unworthy to be in his presence. Jesus, in calling the fisherman to follow him, tells him not to fear. Every one of us is a sinner, and yet Jesus calls each of us to follow him. It is not our own virtues or qualifications, but rather Jesus who empowers us with his grace to respond to his invitation. Brothers, remember St. Paul's words: "I have the strength for everything through him who empowers me" (Phil 4:13).

#### **CHALLENGE:**

I challenge you to go to confession and attend at least one weekday Mass, offering it for the intention to fearlessly answer Christ's call to follow him. Second, I challenge you to participate in or consider starting the Faith in Action Into the Breach program.

Brothers,

Why do people join a group or an organization? Camaraderie? Financial benefits? Activities? Causes? Networking? Assistance? Religion? Or just the inability to say "no"!? Because people are different, it can be difficult to pinpoint why a person is drawn to a particular group. But there is always something that motivates a person to join.

How many members between the ages of 18 and 35 have been added to your council recently? Has your council been planning for its future? More importantly, has your council discussed implementing a plan of action for future growth? Recruiting must be the number one priority in every council.

A popular slogan used in a Marine Corps enlistment campaign stated, "We're looking for a few good men." in the Knights of Columbus we're looking for a lot of good men and their families – Catholic families. We are looking:

- for men and their families concerned about their church, their community and the state of the world in which we live;
- for men and their families who are committed to the principles of charity, unity, fraternity and patriotism;
- for men interested in providing security for their families;
- for Catholic families searching for opportunities, for service and for fun;
- for men who want to be challenged to become leaders in a body of 1.9 million members and their families; and
- for men who are interested in making the world a better place.

Knights know how it feels to be a part of this great organization; the rewards of membership, both personal and social. #### LIFE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

#### Brother Knights,

January was a big month for Life activities in Utah. We kicked off on Sunday, Jan. 16th with the **Bilingual Rosary for Life** at the Monument to the Unborn at Mount Cavalry Cemetery where approximately 50 attended. The weather was crisp but sunny for this moving outdoor event. Thank you to our District Master Dick Hall and Sir Knight Tom Odle who showed up in uniform to represent the Knights. (See photo on page 4.)

January 19th was the start of the **Novena for Life**. Those who registered at the <a href="https://www.9daysforlife.com">www.9daysforlife.com</a> website received a daily email message or text with the day's prayer intercession and reflection. It's a simple, yet powerful, way to engage away from crowds of people.

Then on Friday, Jan. 21st the **Mass for the Unborn** with Bishop Solis and the **Ceremony of Light** was held at the Cathedral of the Madeleine in downtown Salt Lake City. Beginning at 4 PM, our Sir Knights, led by District Marshal Stacey Yeager set up the Candles of Light in the shape of a cross on the front step of the Cathedral and proceeded to stand guard over them until 9:30 PM. Several cars slowed as they drove by to observe and passers-by stopped to ask what was taking place. The vast majority seemed to be in support and were moved by this very public display.

At 6 PM Bishop Solis led a beautiful **Mass for the Unborn**. <a href="https://youtu.be/K9pggrI7kTw">https://youtu.be/K9pggrI7kTw</a>. At the conclusion of the Mass, attendees were invited to come outside and place smaller candles on the steps. Each candle used that evening was meant to represent a portion of the over 62 million lives lost to abortion in America since the passing of Roe v. Wade in 1973. (See photo on page 4.)

From there we got up bright and early the next morning to head to the State Capitol for the **Utah March for Life**. What a fantastic event! The Knights had a booth set up where we passed out K of C signs for the March, shared information about the Knights, and acted as visible witnesses in promoting the Culture of Life. In doing so, six Catholic men stepped up to join the ranks of the Knights.

This was the largest March to date with over 3,000 happy warriors for life attending. At 10:30 AM Bishop Solis led a Rosary with approximately 200 Catholics participating. The event kicked off at 11 AM with Bishop Solis giving the opening invocation followed by opening remarks from Pro Life Utah president Mary Taylor.

Pro Life Utah then presented Sir Knight John Wainscott with their **Guardian of Life** award for his efforts in leading the fundraising for the mobile ultrasound unit which was placed in the Pro Life Utah Mobile Clinic in May 2021. The Utah Knights were also presented with an award for their humanitarian efforts promoting a culture of life. (*Photo at right of John Wainscott holding both plaques.*)

Next came keynote speaker Nick Vujicic. Brothers, he gave a powerful and moving talk. I would highly encourage you to give it a watch/listen <a href="https://bit.ly/32NkNS0">https://bit.ly/32NkNS0</a>. Hear John be interviewed at minute 4:42 and then receive the awards at minute 54. Nick begins his speech at minute 60. Following Nick's speech, we proceeded to line up and do the actual march around the Capitol. Overall, it was a beautiful day both event-wise and weather-wise, and a huge success in getting the pro-life message out. This event is vitally important to show our pro-life legislators that they have a strong support group behind them.



The day was not over. At 4:30 PM, Sir Knight Karl Van Maren and I reconvened at Saint John the Baptist parish in Draper where we, along with Sir Knight Michael "Gunny" Stephenson set up and prepared for a **Nocturnal Adoration for Life**. We attended the 5 PM Mass, and adoration began at the end of Mass (6 PM) and ran until 8:15 AM the following morning (Sunday). It was a long night for all of us but well worth it.

I am very grateful to Brothers Karl and Gunny for joining me and sticking it out all night. Overall we had 85 people attend throughout the night with attendees during every hour. We had all age ranges attend from young children to those in their 80's. We had four teenage girls show up at 2:15 AM and spend a half-hour with our Lord. Most attendees spent 1-2 hours. We had Knights come from Park City and Bountiful to attend. Everyone who came seemed very moved and appreciative of this opportunity. Brothers, if you are looking for a Life event to do in your parish, I would encourage you to consider doing a Nocturnal Adoration. If you would like more detail, please reach out to me.

Thank you to all who attended one or more of these events. Your presence and participation are vitally important. Brothers, the battle for a culture of life is never-ending. Just this past week, January 29th, the Utah legislature proposed an Assisted Suicide bill. As we continue to prepare for a possible shifting landscape with the decision on the Dobbs case we must be ever more vigilant. Please continue to pray for and support our Life efforts and those of the many great organizations here in Utah and around the country.
