Be the example, be like Christ

Brothers, I hope you are all doing well as we find ourselves nearing the end of Lent and preparing for Easter. I hope your Lenten journey has been full of prayer and reflection. One of the main things I have been focusing on this Lenten season is how can I best serve God and how can I evangelize? How can I serve my community and my brother Knights.

I think the first and foremost thing we can all do is be an example of a Christian, love our neighbors, and practice our faith. Be an example of what we learn from Christ. This requires us to take a look at ourselves, to evaluate our own shortcomings. Do we gossip and assassinate other people's character? I bring this up because I had a recent conversation with a non-Catholic, and they said that is one of the main reasons they will never join the church, they see too many of us not practicing our faith. They weren't talking about going to church every Sunday, they were talking about being Christ like, loving our neighbor. This person commented on several instances in their life when they were considering joining the church and got involved in our community activities. This person, on more than one occasion was a victim of the "good" Catholics attacking them, talking ill of their efforts, calling them and others in the community names behind their back, and sometimes to their face. The reason this person shared these experiences with me was to explain why they would never join the Church. This saddened me, obviously these examples aren't the norm, or at least I hope they aren't. But it got me to thinking, how many times do I see a brother Knight talking ill of another brother, a priest, or someone in the community. Then I reflected on myself, do I do this? I'd like to say I don't and I don't think that I do, but this self-reflection has me taking a closer look to make sure I don't. I think this is important, being aware to make sure I/we don't do this; and if we do to stop.

I'm reminded of our second and third principles as Knights: Unity and Fraternity. Are we practicing unity and being fraternal to our brothers? That unity and fraternity extends beyond just our brothers, are we practicing those principles with our neighbors? I hope you don't mind me using this avenue to share these thoughts, but in seeing some recent things I thought important to share in case it sparks a little self-reflection. Please think twice before talking bad about a brother Knight or someone in our community. Be the example, be like Christ.

The next part of my reflection on serving God and evangelizing, after we set a good example which is the evangelizing part, is to invite a man to join. I truly feel in my heart the best thing you can do for a fellow Catholic man and his family is by inviting him to join us. This can help them grow in their faith and provide the avenue to give back.

I hope by now you have registered for the State Convention coming up next month, if not please do so. You can find more information on our state website at www.utahknights.org. I'm very excited to be holding this meeting in person as it will be the first time we've been able to do so in two years! It's going to be a great time of comradery and fraternity! Looking forward to seeing you all there.


KNIGHTS ON BIKES IN UTAH

As usual, the "Guide Sheet" is a concise outline of the program with enough information for the council's Faith Director (or even a new chairman) to get started.

Purpose & Overview: Bring families into a more robust practice and better understanding of our Catholic faith and the Triduum. In an effort to increase parish attendance and involvement, councils conduct a promotional campaign to educate their parishes on the vital importance of Good Friday. Despite Good Friday's central role in the heart of Christianity, attendance at services remains low. In an effort to change this, councils will encourage participation in Good Friday services through a promotional campaign. **Setting an example for their community, Knights will attend Good Friday services with their families and work with their pastors to encourage increased parishioner involvement at these liturgies.** In conjunction with these efforts, councils may also work to educate their parishes about the plight of Christians in the Holy Land.

SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE — APRIL 2022

SCRIPTURE:

STATE SECRETARY'S CORNER



My Brother Knights, spring is finally here and our State Convention will be here shortly; in less than five weeks. After a long wait, we will have the opportunity to meet and socialize in person. I strongly encourage as many of you as possible to attend, so please go to UtahKnights.org and make your hotel and dinner reservations soon! Please prepare for Good Friday (April 15) and Easter (April 17), as these special days will be upon us in two weeks. Let your state team and DDs know if you have any adds to soup or fish dinners; we would love to get out and visit. Other significant upcoming state events over the next few months include: Insurance seminars: May 26 and Jun 23; Fourth Degree exemplifications: May 22 (Cedar City) and June 11 (St. Ambrose) and the State Organizational (Kickoff) Meeting June 25 (St. Thomas More).

This past month, I had the opportunity to get out and around the state.

I was able to attend six council meetings, three CUF ceremonials and three fish fries where I had the opportunity to visit with several of you and promote the States QR code card and scholarship ticket programs. The QR code program will help us with our year end membership push and scholarship tickets to hopefully cover donation shortfalls.

In the administration area, this past month we attained 100% on Form 1728 (Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity) submissions. Semiannual Audits (Jul—Dec 2021) we currently sit at 27/34 councils (79.4%). These reports were due on Feb 15; so please try to get these in as soon as you can. However, In Safe Environment, we need some serious work. As of the end of March, we only have 18/34 councils who are safe environment compliant. We currently have 22 positions that require reappointing since initial appointees did not complete the training within 90 days. Don't miss the Star Council Award on account of this. On the 365 Report, there must be **three different members** assigned as Program Director, Community Director, and Family Director. Grand Knights may only hold **one** of the additional director roles listed. See the Compliance Guide at www.kofc.org/en/resources/safe-environment-program/state-leader-compliance-guide-2021-2022.pdf additional resources are online at www.KofC.org/Safe

On March 27, I sent out the request for contributions to the Perpetual Memorial Fund Book. Here, brother Knights, family and friends can be entered into the perpetual book for a nominal \$20 donation. The proceeds from these collections will go to the scholarship fund.

For those of you who plan to contribute to the Bishop's year end funds (Christopher, Culture of Life, Scholarship, Vocations and/or Military Chaplains), and the Perpetual Memorial Book funds, please try to get those to me by the end of the month. I sincerely appreciate all the contributions that we have received to all the charities that we support. In addition, thanks for your timely state per-capita payments, all but one active council has paid as of this writing.

As of the end of March 2022, the State has processed receipts of \$59,625 with disbursements of \$40,273. Year to date contributions exceed \$33K broken down as follows: Culture of Life \$2,135, Christopher Fund \$730, Scholarship \$1,055, Vocations \$2,257, Carmelites \$1,745, Coats for Kids \$17,474, Memorial Fund \$100, Navajo Strong \$50, KS Tornado Fund \$50, Science Fair \$2,650, Special Olympics \$4,061, Vets Assistance \$351 and Ultrasound Program \$156.00. A sincere thanks to all of you.

Brothers,

Easter is two weeks away. Lent is in full swing, and our churches are full of people looking to reconnect with our faith. Will your council guide a man back by offering a chance to serve, or join you in prayer? Ask a man and his family to join you at every fish fry, every soup supper, every prayer service and at every program you hold in support of lent as we prepare for Easter.

Speak to the RCIA Director in your parish. See when you can talk to the candidates about your council. Get names and addresses so you can send a card or letter congratulating them on joining the Church. Enclose a gift like a prayer card. Later contact them with info about your council and ask them to join. We still have Priests and Deacons that are not Knights. When is the last time you spoke to them about what they want from your Council? Do they know what you have done this year? Have you asked them to join?

We still have several Councils with no new members this fraternal year. Now is the time to recruit. Have a table at every event with a Knight handing out flyers or brochures and asking men to take the QR code and sign up online. In three months, we will begin our new fraternal year. We need new ideas and helpers to assist with our new programs and events.





