Each year currently we encounter the same problems surrounding assemblies qualifying for the Star Assembly Award. Invariably, a District Master will contact us advising he has one or more assemblies which have qualified for and are not listed as a winner.

Each year currently we encounter the same problems surrounding assemblies qualifying for the Star Assembly Award. Invariably, a District Master will contact us advising he has one or more assemblies which have qualified for and are not listed as a winner.

When we find that all qualifying reports have in fact been submitted, a correction is made, and an award is presented.

It is extremely time consuming to research all the required reports from the different departments in the building and, in most cases, we find that one or more report has not been received at supreme or submitted on time.

Masters and VSM's have called the office to advise they have received reports from their assemblies yet in many cases, supreme has not received their copy and the master is unable to provide us with his copy. Particularly the assembly newsletters, copies he should have held to prove six or more were in fact sent out. Some masters tell us they will contact the assembly for a copy, after the deadline.

Once again, I am listing for all the requirements to earn the Star Assembly Award.

- 1. Earn the Fourth Degree Civic Award.
- 2. Enter the "To Be A Patriot" competition. Do not have to win.
- 3. Meet the assembly new member goal.
- 4. Submit the *Report of Officer* #186 due NO LATER than July 1.
- 5. Submit the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity #1728 NO LATER than January 31.
- 6. Submit the Annual Assembly Audit Report #1315 NO LATER than August 1
- 7. Publish a Monthly Newsletter or Bulletin for assembly members.

EFFECTIVE WITH THE 2022-2023 FRATERNAL YEAR REPORTS RECEIVED AFTER THE POSTED DEADLINE WILL DISQUALIFY AN ASSEMBLY FROM RECEIVING THE STAR ASSEMBLY AWARD. NO EXCEPTIONS.

District Masters and Faithful Navigators shall be required to retain copies of all reports in an assembly folder, especially the newsletter and the TBAP, as we do not receive these copies in our office.

Additionally, see that assemblies receive and retain the email receipt from the department the report is submitted to, and see that the assembly sends a copy of the receipt to the Master for his folder so that the report and submission date can be verified.

Ex. If you send a communication to membership you immediately receive a reply email advising your submission has been received. It has a registration number to reference it.

The Assembly needs to hold on to these receipts in the event a report fails to show in our system, it will make verification possible, and an award will be processed.

If this process is followed there should be little doubt a report was in fact submitted on time and received by the proper department. Assemblies earning the Star Assembly Award will then receive their plaque.

Good day Sir Knights! We are into the final few months of the Fraternal Year! It is Spring! It's time to get out of the doldrums and get moving again! We are still in Lent right now. However, we are coming to the High Points of our Catholic Faith. There is Palm Sunday on April 10th and then we begin Easter Week with focus on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil, and Easter Sunday! This culminates Jesus' life, death, and resurrection! This is one of the reasons we are Catholic! Yes, the world around us is a mess. We cannot individually control that; however, we can control doing Rosaries often, if not daily. If your Assembly has not met, now is the time meet up. Subject: VA will propose certain rare cancers be added to presumed service-connected list When the proposal becomes final, dependents, survivors, and Veterans who had claims previously denied for any of the below respiratory cancers would be encouraged to file a <u>supplemental claim</u> for benefits.

- Squamous cell carcinoma (SCC) of the larynx;
- SCC of the trachea;
- Adenocarcinoma of the trachea;
- Salivary gland-type tumors of the trachea;
- Adenosquamous carcinoma of the lung;
- Large cell carcinoma of the lung;
- Salivary gland-type tumors of the lung;
- Sarcomatoid carcinoma of the lung and;
- Typical and atypical carcinoid of the lung.

Any Veteran who had one of these cancers manifest to a degree of 0% or more at any time during or after separation would become eligible for service-connection.

Hearing Aids Connect with Telehealth

Fine-tuning with a telehealth visit saves a trip to the clinic

If you use hearing aids, you know they need to be adjusted as your needs change. Fine-tuning your hearing aid can often be done with an app on a cellphone or smart device. Telehealth is an option for many of your appointments, including some for your hearing. Talk to your health care team and audiologist about how <u>VA Video Connect</u> can help you manage your hearing aid from home.

There are some direct ways to cope with specific PTSD symptoms. Try using these ways of coping to figure out which ones are helpful to you. Then practice them. Like other skills, they work better with practice.

Talk with a mental healthcare provider if symptoms continue for more than a few weeks or disrupt your daily life. Click Here

Unwanted, distressing memories, images, or thoughts

- Remind yourself that they are just that, memories.
- Remind yourself that it's natural to have some memories of the trauma(s).
- Talk about them with someone you trust.
- Remember that, although reminders of trauma can feel overwhelming, they often lessen with time.

Sudden feelings of anxiety or panic. Traumatic stress reactions often include feeling your heart pounding and feeling lightheaded or "spacey." This is usually caused by rapid breathing. If this happens, remember that:

- These reactions are not dangerous. If you had them while exercising, they most likely would not worry you.
- These feelings often come with scary thoughts that are not true. For example, you may think, "I'm going to die," "I'm having a heart attack," or "I will lose control." It is the scary thoughts that make these reactions so upsetting.
- Slowing down your breathing may help.

• The sensations will soon pass and then you can go on with what you were doing. Each time you respond in these positive ways to your anxiety or panic, you will be working toward making it happen less often. Practice will make it easier to cope.

Feeling like the trauma is happening again (flashbacks)

- Keep your eyes open. Look around you and notice where you are.
- Talk to yourself. Remind yourself where you are, what year it is, and that you are safe. The trauma happened in the past, and you are in the present.
- Get up and move around. Have a drink of water and wash your hands.
- Call someone you trust and tell them what is happening.
- Remind yourself that this is a common response after trauma.
- Tell your mental healthcare provider about the flashback(s).

Dreams and nightmares related to the trauma

- If you wake up from a nightmare in a panic, remind yourself that you are reacting to a dream. Having the dream is why you are in a panic, not because there is real danger now.
- You may want to get up out of bed, regroup, and orient yourself to the here and now.
- Engage in a pleasant, calming activity. For example, listen to some soothing music.
- Talk to someone if possible.
- Talk with your healthcare provider about your nightmares. There are treatments that can help.

Difficulty falling or staying asleep

- Keep to a regular bedtime schedule.
- Avoid heavy exercise for the few hours just before going to bed.
- Avoid using your sleeping area for anything other than sleeping or sex.
- Avoid alcohol, tobacco, and caffeine. These harm your ability to sleep.
- Do not lie in bed thinking or worrying. Get up and enjoy something soothing or pleasant. Read a calming book, drink a glass of warm milk or herbal tea, or do a quiet hobby.

Irritability, anger, and rage

- Take a time out to cool off or think things over. Walk away from the situation.
- Get in the habit of exercising every day. Exercise reduces body tension and relieves stress.
- Remember that staying angry doesn't work. It actually increases your stress and can cause health problems.
- Talk with your counselor or healthcare provider about your anger. Take classes in how to manage anger.
- If you blow up at family members or friends, find time as soon as you can to talk to them about it. Let them know how you feel and what you are doing to cope with your reactions.

Difficulty concentrating or staying focused

- Slow down. Give yourself time to focus on what it is you need to learn or do.
- Write things down. Making "to do" lists may be helpful.
- Break tasks down into small doable chunks.
- Plan a realistic number of events or tasks for each day.
- You may be depressed. Many people who are depressed have trouble concentrating. Again, this is something you can discuss with your counselor, healthcare provider, or someone close to you.

Trouble feeling or expressing positive emotions

- Remember that this is a common reaction to trauma. You are not doing this on purpose. You should not feel guilty for something you didn't want to happen and can't control.
- Make sure to keep taking part in activities that you enjoy or used to enjoy. Even if you don't think you will enjoy something, once you get into it, you may start having fun.
- Take steps to let your loved ones know that you care. You can express your caring in little ways: write a card, leave a small gift, or phone someone and say hello.
