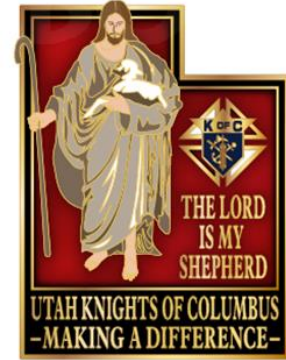

Timeline of Due Dates:

Posters received by Council for judging.....12/15/2022
Council 1st place winners to their District Deputy (DD) for judging12/30/2022
District 1st place winners to State Chairman (Alex Reynoso)01/15/2023

Councils can determine their own prizes of cash and/or [certificates](#) and/or something else. The State will award certificates and a money order for \$25, \$20, and \$15 for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winning posters in each age group. Remember, this is a Faith in Action Community Program.

Last year (for Christmas 2021) we had 315 entries from nine districts representing ten councils and parishes: 5214 – St. Francis Xavier (Kearns), 6010 – St. Rose of Lima (Layton), 6966 – Blessed Sacrament (Sandy), 8606 – St. Peter (American Fork), 9731 – Our Lady of Lourdes (Magna), 10733 – St. George, 12181 – St. John the Baptist (Draper), 15418 – St. Ambrose (SLC) and 16127 – Hill Air Force Base.

- Order Knight of Columbus Poster Contest Kit (CPC-KIT-E) from Supplies Online in [Officers Online](#). Each kit costs \$5.00 (plus tax) with free UPS Ground shipping (usually takes about 7 calendar days). It would be advisable to order this kit by mid-October (or sooner) to ensure timely receipt.
