Utah State Update

Well My Brother Knights here we are, one month out from the State Convention; where did the time go? Many of you have made significant contributions to the Utah Knights this year and I am very honored to lead such a fine group of Catholic gentlemen. We still have three months remaining in this fraternal year, so I would like to encourage you to finish strong. Please take those efforts now so you can set yourselves up for star council.

As we have now closed out 3rd Quarter, Utah now sits at number 34 in the order. In March, we picked up 21 new members going from 113 to 134. We have 7 councils who already have obtained their growth quota. Congratulations to Councils 602, 1129, 1136,6010, 12959, 13297 and 14764. There are 16 other councils out there who sit at greater than 40% than need 3 or less new members over the next 3 months to qualify for the Star Award. Try to focus efforts on those RCIA candidates who just joined our Catholic Faith and emphasize that the Knights are a great way to put their "Faith in Action".

In addition to Growth, supporting programs such as Benefits Seminars, and Safe Environment warrant attention. Fifteen councils in both areas require some work. These two items are really easy to complete right from the comfort of a member's home in front of his computer screen.

Our benefits agents have set up several benefits seminars to help councils qualify for the Founders Award. Six remain for this FY scheduled for April 4, April 11, April 13, April 26, May 23 and June 27. There are 3 different seminar topics that will provide valuable information to those who attend. Participates must complete the four-question survey at the end for their council to attain credit.

The big event (**Annual State Convention**) will be held next month May 5th and 6th at the Comfort Suites Ogden Conference Center. I just found out tonight that the hotel has reached capacity. Paul Tinker is working hard to find alternatives for those of you who were unable to find lodging in the Comfort.

This year's convention has several changes to hopefully provide an enjoyable experience for attendees. The convention will only include sessions on Friday evening and Saturday – no Sunday. We will have a **Cinco De Mayo** celebration on Friday evening followed by a delegate caucus. Saturday will be the business section with Officer and Supreme Convention elections, and Bylaws as last order, followed by Mass and the awards banquet in the hotel. Directly following the banquet, we will have a **Casino Night.**

The **ladies'** agenda has been modified. Mother Teresa Movie will be shown in the morning, followed by the ladies' luncheon at noon, then a Union Station visit in the afternoon. Please go to url: utahknights.org and select your meals now for convention activities so we can have a good headcount.

PROGRAM DIRECTOR'S REPORT FAITH IN ACTION PROGRAMS

April was the second month of the earliest Roman calendar,[3] before Ianuarius and Februarius were added by King Numa Pompilius about 700 BC. It became the fourth month of the calendar year (the year when twelve months are displayed in order) during the time of the decemvirs about 450 BC, when it was 29 days long. The 30th day was added back during the reform of the calendar undertaken by Julius Caesar in the mid-40s BC, which produced the Julian calendar. The Anglo-Saxons called April ēastremonaþ. The Venerable Bede says in The Reckoning of Time that this month ēastre is the root of the word Easter. He further states that the month was named after a goddess Eostre whose feast was in that month. It is also attested by Einhard in his work, Vita Karoli Magni. St George's day is the twenty- third of the month; and St Mark's Eve, with its superstition that the ghosts of those who are doomed to die within the year will be seen to pass into the church, falls on the twenty-fourth.

The sacraments stand as the most significant events in the life of the domestic church. The Knights of Columbus will be there to support and embrace our parish families at these essential moments of encounter with Christ. As children and adult members become more integrated into the life of the church and their parish, they should know that members of the Knights of Columbus will always be present in a tangible and meaningful way. RCIA, Reconciliation, First Communion, and Confirmation are all scheduled the next two months.

Do your Councils have anything scheduled for food drives or ASAP? What about an Adoration or Rosary Program? **The State Council is sponsoring a Devotional at St, John the Baptist Church in Draper on April 12 at 7 PM. EVERYONE INVITED!** Talk to Greg Keller about the St Joseph Pilgrim Icon. How are your plans coming for Good Friday Family Promotion and the Silver Rose (schedule is filling up, contact pabercrombie@comcast.net). And, as always, remember to file a Fraternal Programs Report Form 10784 whenever you complete a program.

CATHOLIC RECIPE: PAASBROD (DUTCH EASTER BREAD)

Traditional Easter bread from Holland.

INGREDIENTS

2 tsp dried yeast

1/2 tsp sugar

1 cup milk

1 tsp mixed spice (pumpkin spice)

1 cup currants (or raisins) and sultanas (golden raisins)

1 tbsp chopped candied peel

1 tbsp melted butter

3 cups flour

Almond Paste:

1/3 cup ground almonds

1/3 cup castor (table) sugar

1 egg yolk

1 tsp lemon juice

DIRECTIONS

Put 1. Warm the milk to blood heat (body temperature) and add the yeast and the sugar.

- 2. Sieve the flour and the spice into a bowl and add the yeast mixture. Mix together to form a dough, cover and leave to rise for 30 minutes.
- 3. Gradually work in the fruit and the melted butter.
- 4. Knead on a floured surface and roll out to an oblong 10 x 5 in./25 x 13 cm.
- 5. Mix the almond paste ingredients to form a firm paste. Roll this into a long sausage-shape and place on the rolled out dough.
- 6. Roll the dough round the almond paste forming the join at the bottom. Glaze with milk and put on a greased baking tray. Allow to rise until doubled in size.
- 7. Bake in oven at 400 degrees for 10 minutes, then 325 degrees for a further 45 minutes or until evenly golden brown.
- 8. Allow to cool and serve sliced with plenty of butter.

STATE ADVOCATE'S REPORT

Brothers.

An update on Safe Environment: Thank you to the 18 Councils that are compliant in their training for this year. Four other Councils just needed one person to complete training already started (hopefully they finished it before April 1). Many of the remaining Councils still need to complete Safe Environment training for at least two of the Program, Family, and Community Directors. Members. Supreme changed the requirements for Safe Environment Training April 2023. Members who have completed ALL assigned training and/or background checks before April 2023 were considered fully compliant. Members who did not complete their training before April 2023, will be assigned new training. These members will be sent an additional email with instructions. I sent out new guidelines to the Grand Knights when they were available.

The tax filing letter from Supreme has not come out yet. The due date for filing the Form 990-N for most of the Councils and Assemblies is May 15, so I sent out detailed instructions to each FS and FC on how to file a Form 990-N e-Postcard.

As stated during this year's Mid-Year Meeting, I have considered some changes to the by-laws, including the floor resolution to discuss changes to elections on Sunday session of State Convention. I submitted revised resolutions to the by-laws, as well as the standard salutations with a request for Council resolutions to the Grand Knights in March. This month, I will submit the final resolutions to the Grand Knights and to the Resolutions Committee for their analysis and advice to the Delegates at the Annual State Convention in May.

Last year, I served as State Membership Director, and we earned Circle of Honor. This year, as State Program Director, I was a resource in assisting the State Directors and Chairmen in supporting councils in selecting, planning, running, and measuring the success of their Faith in Action Programs. Since December, I have served as the State Advocate, helping Councils with Safe Environment, IRS, Insurance, membership, and other issues. According to Supreme, the Advocate must stand for faith, constancy, and wisdom. These are values I possess and have displayed. I ask for your support and vote for State Advocate for the 2023-2024 Fraternal Year.

The council had submitted over 45 entries in the five age groups and had 3 First Place winners, a Second Place winner and a Third Place winner.




