- By conducting well-run programs, your council continues the vision of our founder by assisting people in need, strengthening the bonds that unite our members, and continuing the strategy of Building the Domestic Church.
- This month complete your program planning. By now, the grand knight should appoint program and membership directors. Remember that programs and membership go hand in hand.
- A council cannot conduct successful programs without member support, and without quality faith-filled family programs, prospective members will not be interested in joining your council.

Use your **Fraternal Planner** to:

- Set clear goals for membership growth and engagement through programs and fraternal activities
- Clearly communicate these goals to motivate your council
- Measure your progress and determine the changes needed to chart a more successful course
- Seek opportunities to integrate membership, programs, and charitable activities
- Plan your full program calendar and integrate it with your parish calendar
- Keep track of each month's activities

Things to accomplish in July:

- Organizational Meetings - District Organizational Meetings should be held within two weeks of your jurisdiction's Organizational Meeting
- Hold a review of your 2022-2023 fraternal year. Focus on which membership initiatives and programming activities worked and which could be improved
- Start organizing your fall Church Drive if you decide to have one. Contact your pastor and submit bulletin announcements to the parish secretary
- Begin planning and promotion for the Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest
- Review the safe environment reports in Officers Online to validate safe environment requirements have been met.

Plan ahead for programs taking place this fall:

- Log in to Supplies Online and order any kits/materials needed for holding a Soccer Challenge, Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest, or Free Throw. This year KCIC Poster expands to FIVE grade categories.
- This way councils will have kits in hand and be ready to approach schools in August about running the programs.
- What new program(s) does your council plan to institute this year?
- Which prospects will you be inviting to the next activity your Council holds?

Reminders:

- Meet with your pastor and pastoral staff to set council program dates on the parish calendar.
- Finalize and promote your fraternal program calendar of events, including your degrees and programs to be held.
- Ask someone to join your council
- Show the CUF degree at a Council meeting to advance everyone to 3rd Degree

## CATHOLIC RECIPE: SUMMER APPLE CAKE

The smart cook keeps an eye on the barometer as well as her oven thermometer on July 15. That's because the day belongs to St. Swithin. He lived in the ninth century, has always been acclaimed as a "weather saint." It is said that if it rains on July 15, it will continue to rain for forty days thereafter. Of course, if the sun shines on this day, there will be forty days of fair weather.

St. Swithin's day if thou dost rain For forty days it will remain  
St. Swithin's day if thou be fair For forty days 'twill rain nae mair.

St. Swithin served as counselor to the Saxon king Egbert and later became Bishop of Winchester. Little is known about him except that his feast day is celebrated on the date when his relics were removed from their humble grave and placed in a shrine especially built in his honor. Many miraculous cures were said to have occurred there.

The food associated with St. Swithin in legend and poetry is the apple, and his blessing is asked each year by the apple growers. The ideal dessert for this feast day would be one made of the crisp summer apples that are just appearing in orchards and markets at this time. The Roman Martyrology mentions St. Swithin's birthday (day he died) on July 2. July 15 is usually celebrated as St. Swithin's day, the day his relics were transferred. His feast is not observed on the General Roman Calendar.:

### INGREDIENTS

2 cups biscuit mix  
1/3 cup sugar  
2 eggs, slightly beaten  
1/2 cup heavy cream  
3 cups (approximately) thinly sliced summer apples  
1 teaspoon cinnamon  
1/2 teaspoon allspice  
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg  
1/4 cup sugar  
1/4 cup melted butter or margarine  
Lemon Sauce or Hard Sauce (see recipe)

### DIRECTIONS

Combine biscuit mix and 1/3 cup sugar. Combine eggs and cream; stir into biscuit mix with fork. Spread dough in bottom of greased 8-inch spring form pan. Arrange apple slices on top, pressing cut edges slightly into dough. Combine spices and 1/4 cup sugar; sprinkle over apples. Pour melted butter evenly over all. Cover top with foil. Bake at 400° for 15 minutes. Remove foil; bake 20 minutes longer or until apples are tender and dough tests done. Remove from pan. Serve warm, cut into wedges, with Lemon Sauce (see recipe) or Hard Sauce (see recipe). Makes 6 to 8 servings.

### Lemon Sauce

#### INGREDIENTS

1/4 CUP SUGAR  
1 TABLESPOON CORNSTARCH  
1 CUP WATER  
GRATED RIND OF ONE LEMON  
1-1/2 TABLESPOONS LEMON JUICE

#### DIRECTIONS

Combine sugar, cornstarch, and water in the top of a double boiler. Stir over the hot water until thickened. Remove from heat, add lemon rind and lemon juice, and serve. This can also be reheated gently over the double boiler.

### Hard Sauce

#### INGREDIENTS

1 cup butter, unsalted, softened  
3 cups Confectioner's Sugar, sifted  
1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract  
1/4 cup brandy, cognac, dark rum, or orange juice  
1 egg yolk  
grated zest of 1 orange (optional)

#### DIRECTIONS

Cream butter. Add Confectioner's sugar gradually, and beat until light and fluffy. Add vanilla, liquor of your choice and egg yolk and process until smooth. Transfer to serving bowl. Can be served immediately warm, or can be refrigerate until firm. Bring to room temperature before serving. Makes 2 cups.

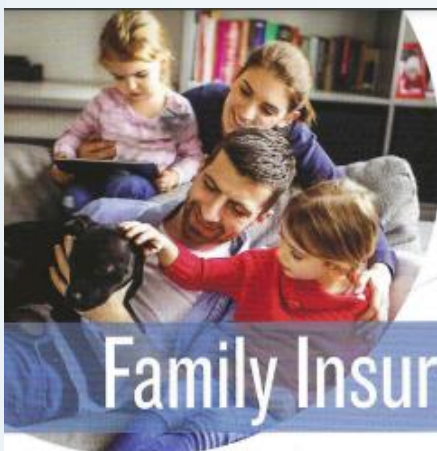
