PROGRAM DIRECTOR'S REPORT



Last week, some of us attended the **Issues and Solutions at the Two Month Point webinar**. Here are some key points of that webinar.

- 1. Now that you have input the Service Personnel Form 365, you need to assign Brothers to any vacancies you have. The Brothers assigned have to be involved in their new roles. They need to show up. Check out Leadership Resources on kofc.org.
- 2. Continue to recruit. With your programs up and running, every event is a recruitment opportunity. This has to be a top priority for GKs and the Council Membership Director. Create and mine a prospect list.
 - a. Greet men after Mass
 - b. Explore family and social interactions
 - c. Have a membership desk at events
 - d. Schedule Church Drives of recruitment events
 - e. Have men use the online membership
 - f. Close the deal by scheduling a live CUF Exemplification

3. Have the GK and the Council FIA Directors (Program, Community and Family) take the Safe Environment Training. Now is the time for the GK to assure that the Council is compliant in the training.

4. You need to have effective communications within the Council, with member families, and parishioners.

a. Personal communication works best either through face to face (best option), phone call, text, email, or social media. Personally inviting and reminding people will increase attendance.

b. Mass communication (such as an email blast) works when done in a timely manner. A reminder e-mail sent one week or more ahead of time gives members sufficient time to arrange their schedule to attend. If you send an event announcement well in advance, then a reminder the night before or day of the event is both appropriate and encouraged.

c. Diversify the medium used to transmit messages. Use email, Texts, Council webpage, Council newsletters, social media, church bulletin, posters, social media, or press releases. You may have to use multiple methods to reach the most people.

- d. Put your events on the utahknights.org calendar to invite members from other Councils.
- 5. Use the resources that are available. Including webinars, how-to training videos, Fraternal Planner, Leadership Resources, Fraternal Leader Advisories, and KofC.org.
- 6. Advance planning is necessary for young and new Brothers. Find out what you can do for your Pastor.
 - a. Set meaningful Faith in Action goals
 - b. Consider Parish / Community needs
 - c. Schedule events with Pastor support
 - d. Budget the expected revenues and expenses
 - e. Have a Comms plan for members, families, parishioners
 - f. Be flexible and responsive
- 7. As a Knight, we are Catholic men who lead, serve, protect and defend. We share a desire to be better husbands, fathers, sons, neighbors and role models and to put charity and community first. We do that by having fun and hosting activities that our families can enjoy.

STATE ADVOCATE'S REPORT

Brothers,

The meaning of September comes from ancient Rome: Septem is Latin and means seven. The old Roman calendar started in March, making September the seventh month. When the Roman senate changed the calendar in 153 BCE, the new year started in January, and September became the ninth month. The Catholic Church dedicates September to Our Lady of Sorrows, a title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary in honor of her suffering and compassion during the Passion and Death of her Son, Jesus Christ. The devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows has a long history in the Church, dating back to the early centuries of Christianity. The Church celebrates the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows on September 15, the day after the Feast of the Triumph of the Cross. The reason for choosing September as the month of Our Lady of Sorrows is because it follows August, which is devoted to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and precedes October, which is devoted to Our Lady of the Rosary. These three months form a trilogy of Marian devotion that highlights the role of Mary in salvation history and her intimate union with her Son. There are many ways to honor Our Lady of Sorrows in September, such as praying the Seven Sorrows Rosary, offering comfort and assistance to those who are suffering, donating to charities that help the needy, bringing an image of Our Lady of Sorrows to someone who is grieving, or praying daily for someone who is in pain.

At the Organization Meeting, I related that Supreme was still working on the portal for Safe Environment training and they would start sending out codes to new officers on July 17. Now, the word from Supreme is "Praesidium Academy sent out invites to key leaders. The Self-registration portal and non-member portal continue to be a work in progress. Unfortunately, we do not have a exact date for you at this time." Once new officers receive their code from Praesidium, they have 30 days to start the training or their name and position will have to be re-entered in Member Management. Make sure your current Grand Knight and Council Program, Community, and Family Directors are all current on their Knights Safe Environment training. DO NOT WAIT until next June to get it done; do it now!

I emailed to the Grand Knights a list of Knights currently certified in the Diocese Safe Environment program. There are several Knights missing. All parents of parochial students and those in most ministries should have their name listed. We need to get the list corrected to show how many Knights are already certified.



CATHOLIC RECIPE: ST. MICHAEL'S GAUFRES (WAFFLES)

This is an American version of St. Michael's Gaufres, or waffles. In France, paper-thin sweet wafers

called gaufres were baked by street vendors who set up their stands near the great cathedral to lure worshipers coming from Mass on St. Michael's Day to taste their wares. Not many people have a gaufrier, the special waffle iron used in France, but if you wish to serve waffles for supper on St. Michael's Day, you'll be right with tradition.

The Feast of St. Michael on September 29 has become a combined feast for the archangels Michael, Raphael and Gabriel. This feast is also called Michaelmas.

INGREDIENTS

2 eggs

1 egg yolk

2/3 cup sugar

1-1/3 cups flour

3/4-1 cup milk

4 Tablespoons melted butter

1/2 teaspoon vanilla

DIRECTIONS

Blend eggs and sugar. Add flour and milk alternately. Beat hard. Add butter and vanilla. The mixture is thin and should spread evenly on the preheated iron. If Gaufres tend to stick, butter both sides of the iron. Serve hot or cold.

CATHOLIC ACTIVITY: Homemade Cross for Holy Cross Day

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross, September 14, is a lovely feastday to thank God for the blessing of Christ dying on the Cross, which opened the gates of heaven for mankind. All Catholic homes should have crucifixes, but here is a suggestion on making a homemade cross and incorporating the family in the project.

Supplies

Nails

Slats of wood

DIRECTIONS

September 14th commemorates the finding of the Cross by St. Helena, and it marks the beginning of Advent in many monastic orders. In most homes there will be a cross or crucifix, but in many cases it is hardly noticed because of its very familiarity. This day might be an occasion when someone in the family undertook to make a new wooden cross and to set it up either indoors or in the garden. If in the garden, the cross could well be a large one. This does not call for much technical skill, and rough workmanship does not matter. At all events the cross could be set up and small slats of wood bearing the names of each member of the family could be nailed across its vertical bar. Someone might explain in a few words this significance of one's own name being thus placed on Christ's cross. Then the story of the appearance of the cross in the sky shortly before Constantine won the battle of the Milvian bridge could also be re-told, with special stress laid on the words that were written in fire round that cross: "In this sign thou shalt conquer!" The cross could remain until after the day of our Lady's Seven Sorrows [September 15].

A few highlights -

"This is a really momentous day in the history of our diocese, and I am tremendously grateful that you are here," Father Christopher Gray, the diocesan Eucharistic Revival point person, told those who gathered for the event's opening prayer. He gave his comments in English and Spanish.

Bishop Oscar A. Solis led the opening prayer, assisted by Deacon George Reade, diocesan chancellor. Those attending filled all the chairs in the room and stood against the wall as they started the worship by singing "We are the Body of Christ" in English and Spanish.

"What a beautiful day God has given us to be gathered as a faith community, filled with joy and ardor for the Eucharist, where we encounter and experience the living presence – the real presence – of Jesus Christ our Lord," the bishop said. "It is an exciting moment for all of us Catholics in the state of Utah. Today we celebrate the importance of the Holy Eucharist as the source and summit of our Christian life and worship. We celebrate what it means to truly be a Eucharistic people, and we celebrate how the Eucharist makes present the relationship God has with each of us. As we journey together today, let us keep in mind that the Eucharist is not only something we receive, but something we become. If we do it with faith, the Eucharist helps transform our life into a gift to God and to our brothers and sisters."

All of the presentations were standing-room only.

Also during the rally was a presentation on the USCCB's "Guidelines for the Celebration of the Sacraments with Persons with Disabilities."

The Diocesan Eucharistic Rally and Mass was the final event of in the diocesan stage of the National Eucharistic Revival. Next will be the parish phase; a national rally next year will culminate the effort. For information, visit <u>www.eucharisticrevival.org</u>.
