# Session 1: Administrative McGIVNEY Award

- This award recognizes excellence in your council's membership growth.
- To earn this award your council must meet or exceed its yearly membership quota.
- The quota is 6% increase in the council's membership as of July 1 (intake only, minimum of five and maximum of fifteen).
- Your specific council quota can be found under the Membership tab in Officers Online.





# Session 1: Administrative COLUMBIAN Award

- This award recognizes excellence in your council's programming and charitable outreach.
- To earn this award your council must conduct and report programs in each of the four program categories (Faith, Family, Community, and Life) for a total of 16 program credits, with four in each category.
- A completed <u>Columbian Award</u>
   <u>Application</u> (#SP-7) must be received by the Supreme Council office before June 30 in order to earn this award.

# Session 1: Administrative FOUNDERS Award

- The Founders' Award recognizes excellence in the promotion of our insurance and fraternal benefits.
- All councils must host / promote at least two Fraternal Benefit Events during the fraternal year.
- The required sum total attendance of members, or member eligible men, at these events must equal or exceed:
- 10 for councils with 99 or fewer members
  - 14 for councils with 100 or more members
- These events are coordinated in conjunction with your local field agent.
- In order for the council to receive credit, the grand knight must submit the new online form #11077 within seven days of the seminar.






#### Ordering Supplies from Supplies Online

- A credit/debit card is REQUIRED (even if there is no charge)
- Searching by item number [usually] works great.
- Watch/Compare shipping costs.

 The FIRST time you place an order, enter a custom location for the shipping destination







#### Ordering Supplies from Supplies Online

- 1. Login to Officers Online
  - 1. <a href="https://www.KofC.org/oo">https://www.KofC.org/oo</a>
- 2. Click "Supplies Online" icon in the "Supporting Applications" section. *Not there?* Look again!



- 3. Find your item(s)
  - Click through the menus (great for finding random stuff)
  - 2. Search by item # (usually on the back cover)
  - 3. Like free? READ the description, check for a DOWNLOAD LINK (for PDFs you can print), and click the item's picture (sometimes it is the full PDF link). *Does it say anything about shipping?*





#### Ordering Supplies from Supplies Online

#### Notes:

- Some items need approval.
  - You only find that out AFTER you try and order them.
  - It usually is next business day.
  - Examples: Pilgrim Icon Prayer Cards (11221), Choose Life Signs (9341)
- Check Shipping Costs
  - US Postal "USPS Env/Stamp" usually cheapest.
  - UPS Ground *could* be free (depends on the item)
- Remember Shipping Time
  - Give it 7 calendar days to arrive using USPS or FedEx Ground.

  - Add them to your cart, then click "save for later"
  - Might want to do this if an item is backordered.





#### **Fraternal Benefits**



Orphan Fraternal Benefit (for insured members only)

\$500 / month through age 18 for each eligible orphan

+ \$5,000 / year college tuition: max \$20,000

For example, assume newly orphaned children ages 8,10, & 12: Monthly payments would total \$162,000; tuition adds \$60,000 => \$222,000 total payout on this orphaned family situation.

#### **Fraternal Benefits**



Family Fraternal Benefits (for insured members only)

Child dies prior to 61 days old: \$5,000

Still born baby 20+ weeks: \$5,000

Guaranteed Issue (GI Policy): \$10,000

1. Child prior to 61 days old (standard rates, whole life policy)

2. Uninsurable child > 60 days but < 18 years (max substandard whole life policy)

3. Child with intellectual disabilities aged 3-18 (standard rates, whole life policy)

#### Diocesan Safe Environment Program What is Safe Environment?

The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People is a comprehensive set of procedures originally established by the USCCB in June 2002 for addressing allegations of sexual abuse of minors by Catholic clergy. The *Charter* also includes guidelines for reconciliation, healing, accountability, and prevention of future acts of abuse. It was revised in 2005, 2011, and 2018.





#### Diocesan Safe Environment Program The Charter

- Creating a safe environment for children and young people;
- Healing and reconciliation of victims and survivors;
- Making prompt and effective response to allegations;
- Cooperating with civil authorities;
- Disciplining offenders;
- Providing for means of accountability for the future to ensure the problem continues to be effectively dealt with.

Safe Environment Programs are a response to the Charter.





### Diocesan Safe Environment Program Why it Matters

- Victim survivors say their healing is greatly impacted by knowing and seeing that the Church is actively doing something....and will continue to do so.
- Abuse happens in every demographic and income level.
- Children are most often sexually abused by someone they know and trust.
- Predators groom a community (usually seek a position of authority and trust)
- Offenders interviewed say they prey on churches because they have easy access to children without screening.
- They also rely on "church forgiveness".
- Church predators are usually volunteers (not clergy)
- Predators are not always men!






#### Diocesan Safe Environment Program Research & Data

Research estimates 1 in 4 girls and 1 in 6 boys will be sexually abused before they turn 18.

"The prevalence of child sexual abuse is difficult to determine because it is often not reported; experts agree that the incidence is far greater than what is reported to authorities"

#### Diocesan Safe Environment Program Research & Data

- One in seven children have experienced child abuse or neglect in the past year.
- More than 600,000 children are abused in the U.S. each year.
- It's estimated that over 50% of adults don't recognize a boundary violation when it happens right in front of them.





#### Diocesan Safe Environment Program Research & Data

"As of April 2024, thirty-eight US Catholic religious organizations have sought bankruptcy protection in chapter 11. Twenty-four cases have concluded. Fourteen cases are pending."

## Diocesan Safe Environment Program Who is Responsible for Safe Environment?

Through scripture and Catholic teachings, we are all called to protect the life and dignity of all human persons. Preventing child abuse is a necessary response to what we are called to do as Church, God's Church.

By placing every child at the heart of the kingdom of God, let us remember our Lord's words:

"Let the children come to me, do not hinder them; for to such belongs to the Kingdom of heaven." Matthew 19:14"





### Diocesan Safe Environment Program An Effective Program

Churches, schools, and youth organizations must ensure that children (youth minors) and vulnerable adults who worship, study, or participate in activities sponsored by a diocesan parish, school or other organization can do so in the safest and most secure setting possible.

The Safe Environment Program must meet the requirements of the *Charter!* 





### Diocesan Safe Environment Program Compliance Requirements

- Codes of Conduct for clergy and other paid personnel as well as for volunteers who have contact with minors or vulnerable adults.
- Training for all adults and youth minors who have contact with minors or vulnerable adults
  - Signs to look for
  - Actions that should be taken
  - Local Laws
- Screening (i.e., application, background check, fingerprinting, etc.)
   for all adults in contact with minors or vulnerable adults.
- A training program for children that includes age-appropriate materials pertaining to personal safety that conforms to Catholic Teaching that is taught annually.





### Diocesan Safe Environment Program An Effective Program...

- Protects children from abuse through awareness
- Trains the community to be aware of signs of grooming behavior and abuse
- Encourages boundaries
- Rebuilds trust in church leadership
- Promotes healing





#### Diocesan Safe Environment Program Definitions

**Definition of "Contact":** Anyone working with or around minors or vulnerable adults **even one time**. This includes in-person contact, as well as digital contact such as email, social media, online meetings such as Zoom, Teams, etc.

#### **Definition of "Vulnerable Adult":** At a

minimum, according to Utah Code Section 76-5-111, is "a "Dependent adult" which means an individual 18 years old or older, who has a physical or mental impairment that restricts the individual's ability to carry out normal activities or to protect the individual's rights."

#### **Diocesan Safe Environment Program** *Diocesan Compliance Requirements*

**ALL** clergy and diocesan employees (pastoral center, parish, school) as well as volunteers whose duties involve \*contact with minors and \*vulnerable adults must:

- Be screened, including a background check for criminal convictions and sex offender status (youth minors do not get a background check);
- (2) Abide by the Safe Environment Policies, the Codes of Conduct; and
- (3) Complete Safe Environment training appropriate to their role(s).

If any person is not in compliance with these requirements, they may not work at a parish or school, or volunteer in any role that would put them in contact with minors or vulnerable adults.





## **Church Safety Historical Precedence**

- 1. During the time of Christ, these brave men were known as "doorkeepers of the temple"
- 2. Clerical Order of the Porter started in the 3<sup>rd</sup> century AD.
- 3. The duty of the Porter was to guard the entrance to the church against intruders who might disturb the service.
- 4. 1972, Pope Paul VI handed the Order over to the Laity.

"it is the job of the man, the husband, the father, the brother, the son, the knight to carry on this noble tradition and serious responsibility to protect the parishioners, the priests and each other."







#### **Church Safety**

#### The Reality of Our Need for Awareness and Vigilance

- 1. Catholics deserve the right to feel safe while attending mass, adoration, confession, social events and parish related activities.
- 2. Traditionally, the parishioners took on this role in "the event something happened"
- 3.Lack of planning, training and coordination within a team unit leads to chaos and casualties.
- 4. The time to coordinate and start a parish security team is now, as the threat level has dramatically increased.

## Arson, Vandalism, and Other Destruction at Catholic Churches in the United States

At least 330 incidents have occurred across 43 states and the District of Columbia since May 2020. Incidents include arson, statues beheaded, limbs cut, smashed, and painted, gravestones defaced with swastikas and anti-Catholic language and American flags next to them burned, and other destruction and vandalism.







Hostility and violence against churches in America is at an all-time high, according to a recent Family Research Council report. They documented *more than* 430 incidents in 2023 - more than double the number in 2022. That's an 800% increase in incidents since 2018 and an average of 39 attacks every month.









### **Incidents per Year across Catholic Churches Since 2018**

Incidents per year, January 2018-November 2023










## Statistics by Attack Trigger of the 17 Mass Murders Associated with Faith-Based Organizations



The overall top reasons (attack triggers) for all 2,183 deadly force incidents are different from those of the 16 most violent (mass murder) attacks. While "bias" related (against any religion or people group) is very uncommon (5.08%) of 2,183 recorded incidents, it is the most common reason for a mass murder event. 6 of those 16 attacks (37.5%) were bias motivated.








#### Church Safety 2023 stats through November: Types of Incidents

Types of incidents, January 2023-November 2023









#### **Church Safety**







**ATTACK TRIGGERS:** Nearly 53% of all deadly force incidents at faithbased organizations are due to a robbery, domestic violence, or a personal conflict.

**PARKING LOT:** Over 75% of deadly force incidents occurred (or began) outside on ministry property, parking lot or activity location.

**AFTER HOURS:** Over 61% of attacks occurred when no event was happening.





## What are some of the "triggers" that are linked to increased church violence?

- The leak of the draft Supreme Court opinion overturning Roe v. Wade led to another spike in attacks - since then, there have been 236 attacks on Catholic churches.
- CatholicVote has only found evidence of an arrest in about 25% of the cases it tracked and estimates that the attacks have caused around \$25 million in physical damages to churches.
- Increase in popularity of President Trump and other conservative politicians.
- Change in left leaning policy at state and federal levels.







The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Religious Liberty is warning of attacks on churches as "the largest threat to religious liberty in 2024" to the point where it threatens the lives of people of <u>faith</u>.

The USCCB also warned that "the highly charged atmosphere around the 2024 election might lead far-left extremists to escalate the severity of attacks on Catholic churches, and far-right extremists may view Catholic churches and Catholic Charities facilities as targets for anti-immigrant sentiment or, worse, violent action."


- 1. Meet with your pastor and gain an understanding of his level of understanding of the issues.
- 2. Request approval to start a team that is a separate group from the ushers: different mission.
- 3. Network with like-minded parishioners and begin to outline your team and plan.
- Should have training in self defense and situational awareness.

- include detailed mapping of parish and parish campus with egress.
- understand state & federal firearm laws.
- understand personal liability responsibilities and risks thereof.
