

Last month's webinar on **Preparing for Advent/Christmas** webinar gave several good ideas for activities. First thing to do is discuss with your Pastor to plan and remember to live your faith. December we will begin the Jubilee Year of Hope. You could begin COR, hold a Holy Hour, or Bible Study. Sponsor a giving tree, visit from St. Nick, caroling, or a tree lighting. You could order Christmas cards, yard signs, or KCIC car magnets for gifts or fundraisers.

Church attendance increases in the month of December. Plan your activities now. Be visible, welcome everyone, invite families to your next activities, and recruit new members.

Men are waiting for you to invite them to join the Knights of Columbus. Here are two easy ways you and the members of your council can invite men to join:

Use Online Join Cards (#11689). Fill in your council number and member number and keep a few in your wallet at all times. You never know when the opportunity will arise to invite someone you're talking to – on the sidelines of your kid's game, at the coffee social after Mass, or even at the next tailgate party. Give the cards out as a quick way to say, "I'd like to invite you to become a Knight of Columbus!"

2. Send out "On Mission" Invitations (#11732). Work with your pastor to identify men in your parish that should join the Knights of Columbus. At your next council meeting, ask members to write out two invitations each and send them to the prospects. Be sure to personalize the card and perhaps invite him and his family to your next event.

- If your council accounting period ends June 30, then November 15 is the deadline to ensure that your council submits the proper <u>IRS Form 990</u> (US Councils only). Ensure that this paperwork is filed.


Greetings Utah Knights of Columbus Leaders!

Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest

Brothers,

How many members in your Council have children, nieces, nephews, grandchildren, or neighbors who have Catholic children? Are any of the children in the $8^{th} - 12^{th}$ grade? Children in the $8^{th} - 12^{th}$ grade are eligible for the **Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest.** Granted, having a child write an essay that is optional is a tough sell, but several Councils have utilized their parish CCD, parochial schools and youth groups to provide entries. Maybe a child you or your members know, enjoy creative writing.

Each year, councils invite children in grades 8-12 to write unique essays on topics of interest. Please contact schools, parish families, and home school groups as soon as possible to promote this program. Maybe your Council could even advertise the contests in your parish bulletin or online website. This contest is open to all the Catholic youth in your parish, in the 8th through 12th Grade. Your Council will be amazed at the beautiful write-ups you receive. For more information, please review the program's <u>Guidebook</u>.

This is a Faith in Action – Community program. It encourages youth to become citizens grounded in their faith through creative writing and is open to all qualifying Catholic students. This contest encourages today's youth to be more connected to their community and their faith. Entries are due to the Council by December 15th.

Virtue is a habitual and firm disposition to do good. It governs our acts, orders our passions, and guides our conduct by reason and faith. It also encourages Christians to live in a relationship with the Holy Trinity. The call to live a virtuous life applies to individuals in every state of life and occupation, including our elected leaders. This years' topic is:

In an essay of 500-750 words, what are the two most important virtues for an elected leader to possess, and why? How can you determine if the leader has these virtues?

Sent to Council for Judging	12/15/24
1st place winners to District	12/27/24
District winners to State	1/10/25

Councils can determine their own prizes of cash and/or certificates and/or something else. The State will award certificates and an award for \$50, \$30, or \$20 for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winning essays in each grade. Remember, this a Faith in Action Community Program.
