

About state membership growth this month, as of Dec. 26, we have brought in 118 new knights, or 56% of the goal. With these members, Utah stands at 56.7% or 9th in the order. THANK YOU!

The Diocesan Science Fair will soon be on us - February 1, 2025. This year's event will be at Juan Diego Catholic High School. We need judges to make this a success, so please volunteer. SS. Bill McCauley will send an email shortly to those councils who graciously contributed support last year for a science fair award. The State Council and District Deputies met with our benefits advisor, William Mundy, to discuss his new plan to help councils qualify for the Founder's Award. Based on the results from the insurance seminar, we only have qualified, and other councils are partially qualified; councils need two benefits seminar credits before the end of the year.

 officers are able to attend.
- The Founders' Award and Star Council Award require councils to promote and participate in two fraternal benefit seminars. In order to ensure your council is properly credited, it is essential that you complete the <u>Fraternal Benefits Event Council Report</u> (#11077) and submit it in a timely manner after the seminar.
- Familiarize yourself with the Faith in Action programs form <u>reference guide</u> and share it with your programs team.


