Our Lenten penances shouldn't simply be exercises in self-discipline, but rather a participation in the love of God

ON MY WAY to the most recent meeting of the Knights Columbus Board of Directors, my flight was delayed. First it was an hour. Then another. After a five-and-a-half hour delay and a four-and-a-half-hour flight, I finally arrived at my destination at 3 o'clock in the morning.

For some, Lent can feel like a lot like my travel experience: a test of one's patience and endurance. And so often, we just give up the struggle. Our Lenten resolve weakens. We abandon bodily penance and relax our efforts to overcome our vices. Patience and endurance run out.

But Lent is not a do-it-yourself moral improvement program. Rather, it is about opening the heart anew to God's love. It is a gift from God, a time rich in grace when he helps his children get rid of all that hinders us from sharing in his life and love. Bodily penances and spiritual exercises are the means the Holy Spirit employs to purify our hearts, enabling us to renew and deepen our relationship with God and neighbor. The more deeply we grow to love God, the more we will be like God and love like him.

God created us in love to reflect his truth, goodness and beauty, and to return freely the love he has showered on us. Yet, from the beginning, sin entered the picture, and humanity has willfully rejected God's love, refusing to be what God created us to be: living reflections of his glory. Scripture attests that this continual infidelity deeply wounds God's unchanging, infinite, passionate love.

One of the most beautiful attributes of God is his patient endurance. The Psalms repeatedly praise God because he is "slow to anger and abounding in mercy." Despite the persistence of sinfulness, God has not given up on us.

In assuming our humanity, the Son of God revealed the Father's patient and enduring love. He preached a message of repentance. He told us the parable of the Prodigal Son. He healed the sick and raised the dead as a sign of his power over sin and death. But in the end, the Lord of glory was crucified. In his passion and death, the innocent Lamb of God patiently bore on his shoulders the sins of the world.

As Jesus underwent his agony, he revealed the enormity and ugliness of sin. Though sinless, he experienced the darkness and alienation from God produced by sin. His wounds penetrated to his heart and revealed the woundedness of the Father's loving heart. Jesus endured all of this out of love for his Father and for us. In the end, his patient endurance unleashed the power of God's changeless love, which alone overcame sin and death. This is the victory that we celebrate as Lent gives way to Holy Week and Easter.

As we receive God's patient and enduring love and are transformed by it, we become participants in Christ's redeeming love. We too bear the cross, for the redemption of our own sins and the sins of others.

If our Lenten penances are understood in this light, and undertaken in faith and with openness to God's grace, they take us to the very heart of God's love for us, which is revealed in Jesus' death and resurrection. They help us come to terms with our sinfulness. They open us to the love the crucified and risen Savior continues to lavish on us in the Holy Eucharist and other sacraments. As we receive God's patient and enduring love and are transformed by it, we become participants in Christ's redeeming love. We too bear the cross, for the redemption of our own sins and the sins of others. We learn how to forgive.

Patient and enduring love is the hallmark of a true disciple. It is also our hallmark as Knights of Columbus. Experience teaches that unity and fraternity demand charity – not merely the charity to defuse tensions but the patient and enduring charity that comes from God. "Be imitators of God, as beloved children," Paul wrote, "and live in love, as Christ loved us and handed himself over for us as a sacrificial offering to God" (Eph 5:1-2



Message from the Vice Supreme Master – March 2025

Sir Knights, greetings,

I just attended the 125th Anniversary Exemplification, Mass and banquet in New York City. Prior to the Exemplification in St. Patrick Cathedral, we had an unveiling and dedication of a larger-than-life statue of Father Michael J. McGivney. In the words of Timothy Cardinal Dolan, "America's Parish Priest is now in America's Parish Church." The statue will be permanently located in the St. Joseph side chapel, near the front of the Cathedral. Following the dedication, the Exemplification started with the Prayer for the Canonization of Blessed Michael McGivney by our Supreme Friar, Archbishop William E. Lori, and the singing of the first two verses of America the Beautiful. After the "Master's Final Charge", the Cantor led everyone in the last two verses of America the Beautiful. The Knighting Ceremony followed. I was one of 28 Dignitaries and Vice Supreme Masters stationed around the Cathedral to confer the honor and title of "Sir Knight" on the more than 700 candidates who had been exemplified.

Mass followed with His Eminence Timothy Cardinal Dolan as the Principle Celebrant and His Excellency Archbishop William E. Lori and more than a dozen Faithful Friars and Worthy Chaplains from the surrounding areas as concelebrants. It was a most exciting and inspiring Inaugural Presentation of the Revised Exemplification of Patriotism.

From now until June 30th, whether you use the current or the Revised Fourth Degree ceremonial, the entire ceremony, from the antechamber to the closing procession, is open to families, friends and parishioners.

A well-known saying about March is "in like a lion, out like a lamb". This proverb refers to the fact that March begins while it's still winter, but spring has started by the end of the month. When I was growing up, we always used this saying to reflect that if the month started with a storm, snow or otherwise, it ended with nice warm days. We also used the reverse, which seemed to be truer on the East coast; if it started out nicely it ended up badly. Another quote I came across is "March is a time to grow and a time to bloom." I like this phrase. I think it's appropriate for us now that we've begun our 125th Anniversary Year of celebration. It clearly expresses our challenge to make this year a "banner year" in recruiting men into the fourth degree and creating new assemblies.

Besides being the name of this month, the word "march" has many uses and meanings depending on how we use it. Among those meanings are; "to tread, move", "to move along with a steady regular stride especially in step with others", "to move in a direct purposeful manner" and "walk in unison." This is what we need to do now, to join with our brother Sir Knights and in a direct purposeful manner expend the necessary energy to grow the number of members in the fourth degree within our assemblies, district and province. Now, every third degree knight has the opportunity to see and hear what the fourth degree is about; why we exist and what we symbolize. Invite, no rather bring, every council member you know to an exemplification so he can be inspired to join. Then invite him to participate with you in an assembly event and finally invite or re-invite him to join. Inviting men to join us is like kneading bread dough; you roll it, you punch it, you roll it, you punch it and then you roll it, you punch it some more.



Last November I wrote to you about being "on mission", communicating clearly, being visible, engaging in focused recruitment, and the importance of invitations. If you still have that newsletter, read through my message again, it's still relevant today. If you don't have it, I'll repeat the part about invitations.

"...an invitation communicates the same message independent of whether the invitation is accepted. At times, we don't invite people because we don't think they would be interested or they don't have time or they've declined in the past. Especially young men who may have declined invitations so many times that it might seem they're not interested in what we are offering. Look past this and continue to extend the invitation. Just remember—the invitation has value even if they say no. Just keep inviting—who knows? Perhaps today you'll get a yes!"

Dates of note in March:

- March 1, 1781: The Continental Congress adopted the Articles of Confederation, the first constitution of the United States.
- March 5, Ash Wednesday: the start of Lent.
- March 8 9, Jubilee of the World of Volunteering
- March 15, the Ides of March: The day in 44 BC when Julius Caesar was assassinated by senators.
- March 17, St. Patrick's Day: A day to celebrate the death of Saint Patrick, Ireland's patron saint
- March 19, Feast of St Joseph: Patron Saint of the Universal Church, Unborn Babies, Families, Fathers, Immigrants, Social Justice, Carpenters, those Seeking Employment, Realtors, a Happy Death.
- March 21, 1965: Martin Luther King Jr. led a civil rights march from Selma to Montgomery, Alabama.
- March 25, Feast of the Annunciation: The Archangel Gabriel appeared to Mary and revealed God's will that she become the Mother of the Son of God and she accepted.
- March 28 30, Jubilee of Priests Instituted as "Missionaries of Mercy"
- March 29, Founder's Day: Connecticut State General Assembly grants a charter to the Knights of Columbus.

Tasks to start;

- **Focused recruiting:** Start now and continue until your District has the required number of candidates to meet the 125th Anniversary Exemplification challenge.
- **To Be A Patriot Award:** Begin to collect supporting data and writing the narrative. Must submit to District Master no later than 30 April.
- Civic Award: Identify the four patriotic events that you will describe on the application. Must submit to Supreme no later than 30 June. IMPORTANT NOTE: Send a cc copy to both your District Master and VSM. Without these copies we can't help you if Supreme doesn't give you credit.

As April approaches, two significant programs are on the horizon for members of the Fourth Degree:

1. Korean & Vietnam War Census Program

- o **Due Date:** April 25, 2025
- This initiative aims to create a comprehensive record of service for veterans of the Korean and Vietnam Wars. Given that the Korean War started in 1950, surviving veterans are now approximately 91 years old. Those who served in Vietnam between 1965 and 1973 are typically aged 68-76. These wars represented pivotal changes in military service and the treatment of returning veterans, especially for those who served in Vietnam, who often faced a divided nation upon their return.
- Census Process: Assemblies are encouraged to work with their assigned councils
 to conduct the census using the most current form available here. It is crucial to
 document the service of both living and deceased members who meet the
 established criteria for the Korean Service Medal and Vietnam Service Medals.
- **Recognition:** Certificates will be presented to surviving veterans through their councils. District Masters are advised to collaborate with Faithful Navigators and local Grand Knights to host a celebratory dinner or party for the veterans receiving these certificates, accompanied by a 4th Degree Honor Guard to honor their service.

2. To Be A Patriot Award Program Application

- Each assembly is invited to submit a report on their most outstanding patriotic activity (using form #TBP-2) to the District Master. This program aims to recognize assemblies that exemplify the ideals of patriotism.
- **Evaluation Criteria:** The selection process involves assessing the project based on several factors, including its embodiment of patriotism, member participation rates, community impact, originality, and publicity effectiveness.

Important Dates to Remember:

- April 30: Assemblies must submit their To Be A Patriot applications to the District Master
- May 15: District Masters should submit their top entry to the Vice Supreme Master.
- May 31: Vice Supreme Masters need to forward their province's top entry to the Supreme Master.

A committee appointed by the Supreme Knight and Supreme Master will review all entries, and winners will be announced by the Supreme Masters office.

Let's honor the sacrifices made by our veterans and recognize the valuable contributions of our assemblies to our communities.

When I think about March, my mind goes to Lent. This year Lent begins on March 5th, which is Ash Wednesday. We are reminded that we are sinners in need of God's grace. The ashes representing death remind us of our own death. We ponder our death so that we can live well and live more united with Christ. "Momento Mori" is part of our first principle, Charity, and is Latin for "remember you must die."

Especially during Lent, we are called to repent and to the healing sacrament of Reconciliation that will cleanse our soul. The overall goal is to grow in humility. Lent is 40 days of fasting, penance and almsgiving. This is the time for us to reflect on Jesus' passion and death and unite ourselves more closely to Him. We fast on Fridays and abstain from meat in honor of the Lord and offer our sacrifice to the Lord. It is also a time to detach ourselves from things of the world that will pass away and to set our mind on things that last into eternity.

There are many ways to celebrate Lent. For example, at your Parish, attend their Fish Frys and Soup Suppers established by the Knights of Columbus. Attend Stations of the Cross every Friday during Lent and go to confession every couple of weeks. Increase your participation in Adoration and focus on prayers i.e. Prayer before the Crucifix. Add a simple practice such as the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. Give up things like social media and secular television. Perform a charitable act of kindness for your neighbor.

On March 29, 1882, the Charter of the Knights of Columbus was approved by the state of Connecticut, a date that is celebrated annually as "Founder's Day."

O Most Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of Mercy, at this most critical time, we entrust the United States of America to your loving care.




Look down with mercy upon us and touch the hearts of our people. Open our minds to the great worth of human life and to the responsibilities that accompany human freedom.


O Merciful Mother, give us the courage to reject the culture of death and the strength to build a new Culture of Life. *Amen*.

Wearing of the Uniform

I received an email from a new District Master last week. He had a question from a member of one of his assemblies and was unsure how to answer, which was:

Could he wear the Fourth Degree uniform blazer with other slacks and a regular tie when going out with this wife? **The answer is: No**

Our uniform was designed to be worn complete with the Fourth Degree blazer, official slacks, tie, and official Fourth Degree pin (PG-113). It also requires a white dress shirt with no button-down collar, black shoes, and black socks. However, it may be worn in social settings such as Knights of Columbus events, banquets, exemplifications, meetings, and church.

The other components of the uniform are used when participating in our color corps (color guard or honor guard). Those include the official beret with flash representing office (if any), white gloves, a service baldric, a Fourth Degree sword with scabbard. Flag bearers would not wear baldric or sword. (Note that the service baldric is either a general member baldric or else a specific color to indicate your current office held).


So, if you want to show your pride as a member of the Fourth Degree, then wear all the components according to the laws and rules of the Fourth Degree.




