I renewed that oath once more when I was installed as State Deputy of Utah. I will never stop doing what is right for the Knights of Columbus, nor will I stop protecting our fraternity, families, and friends from any threat — whether it comes from within or outside the Order. Is it fall or winter outside? We've had a few brisk mornings lately — too cold for a ride on Ruby — yet we can still enjoy the outdoors. All Hallows' Eve has passed, and All Saints and All Souls Days are upon us. Please pray for Blessed Michael McGivney's canonization on All Saints Day and remember those who have gone before us on All Souls Day.

An update on Blessed Father McGivney's second miracle: it is currently under investigation by the Vatican. Soon, Blessed Michael McGivney may be recognized as Saint Michael McGivney! It's been a tough year for us — we've lost many brother Knights, including young men, priests, and deacons. Yet, even amidst sorrow, Utah continues to thrive. We've now completed four months of the fraternal year and have welcomed many new Knights to our councils.

Utah currently ranks #1 in the entire Order with 93.49% of our membership growth goal achieved! This means there are many new leaders eager to serve our Lord — and it's up to each of you to help them succeed.

Our "Fishers of Men" program continues to be a great success. Council 7963 leads the way at 1700% of its membership goal — a remarkable "17-Star" achievement! Utah is truly doing incredible things and setting the bar high for the Order.

I ask each of you to help new members become active in your councils. Share your knowledge, mentor new leaders, and inspire them to continue the mission Blessed Michael McGivney began. New members bring new ideas and expand our ability to serve our parishes and communities. "Coats for Kids" distribution is underway. A special thank-you to our Former District Master Bob Masse, PSD, for doing a superb job coordinating and shipping coats to councils. Now, we just need your help for the final step — putting those coats on deserving children's backs.

Good news for our councils: I want to give a special shout-out to our brother and Field Agent William Mundy, and our State Secretary Bill Kelly, IPSP, for their excellent work in helping form new councils in Heber City, Moab/Monticello, and soon St. Ann in Salt Lake City. William is also working closely with Nate Raso to help our Utah Knights understand the valuable products the Knights offer. He will be visiting assemblies and councils to host local benefit seminars to assist you in earning your Founder's Awards.

Thank you to all councils that have submitted their per capita payments and Coats for Kids pledges. This greatly helps the State's cash flow given our modest budget. I respectfully request partial or full payments by the end of November or as soon as possible to State Secretary Bill Kelly. Our Safe Environment compliance still needs improvement. An effective first step would be assigning Directors positions in your councils. If you need assistance, please reach out to your District Deputies or the State Advocate.

Please check our calendar for upcoming events this month. Veterans Day is November 11 — to all our veterans, please get out there and enjoy your well-earned freebies, and most importantly, thank you for your service.

As Thanksgiving approaches, I would like to take this opportunity to wish you, your families, and your friends a Blessed Thanksgiving.

State Secretary

My Brother Knights,

Daylight Savings Time ends this weekend; Veterans Day and Thanksgiving just around the corner where the time has gone. We are 33% through our fraternal Year and the Utah Knights keep breaking records! This is all possible because of council and members dedication and tireless efforts towards Father McGivney's mission. Thanks to your efforts, as of Oct 30th, Utah has brought in 244 new members currently sitting at Number 1 in the order achieving 93.5% of the States Annual Goal! In addition, we have set a record for council intake for October where 135 men joined Utah Councils. Year to date, an astonishing 216 men (88.5%) of our online new members transferred as active members in your council ranks.

Council achievements include 10 councils who have already met their membership goal, thus qualifying for the Father McGivney award. Congratulations to Councils 602, 5502, 6739, 8350 and 15418 who join Councils 1129, 6010, 6147, 7961, and 18795 in attaining this achievement. In addition, we have 12 councils who have surpassed 33% of their membership. The official results for the Fishers of Men contest are not in, but unless a miracle happens in the next two days, two Utah councils will place in Supremes incentive program. With the significant growth we have been experiencing, please review your online membership rosters, encourage your online prospects to complete the CUF and get them active in your councils. As of Oct 30th, we have 108 men that we can convert to active Utah knights into your councils. Great work for the first quarter, but let's kick off the next quarter with a bang by converting 80 plus members from the online roster to council membership.

In addition, congratulations to DD3 Alex Reynoso for winning the SD's 1st Quarter FY25-26 membership incentive award.

This past weekend, the state council, honor guards, knights from across the state and the membership team supported the Mexican Martyr Relics at St. Joseph the Worker. Many Catholics in Utah attended this event for reverence purposes, holy hour devotionals, processions, and Holy Mass. The event also provided a great opportunity to promote the Utah Knights and made attendees aware of the purpose we serve. Thanks to the promotion efforts by Father Silva, Supreme reps (Jose and Pona), GK Juan, Member Director Bill Mundy and his team, the state collected over 70 cards of men interested in becoming Utah knights.

I am pleased to report that Supreme instituted our newest council 18795 in Moab/Monticello on August 30, 2025. Congrats and welcome the new council leadership to the team. In New council development area, we will now focus our efforts to St. Anns in Salt Lake City. We have several activities scheduled to get men from that Parish as part of our Utah team.

This past month we completed distribution on the 2025-2026 Directory. Hopefully, everyone received their copy {ies}; if not send me a text/email and Doug Shane will get one to you. Also, if you notice errors, please let both Doug and I know, and we will update the electronic copy. Thanks to 28 councils and the 8 assemblies who have submitted their 25-26 Per Capita. This really helps the state manage our funding. With the State's coats for kids' program in full swing, this enables us to leverage funding for order payments pending pledge payments or council coat drive donations. Our chairman Bob Masse has submitted several orders already to ensure we coats on

hand before the weather goes south. Please, if you have a pledge or an order try to submit payments as soon as you can to the State Secretary.

Regarding administrative requirements, we need help from seven councils to submit their Jan-Jul25 semiannual audits. Like I mentioned last month, if you are behind on audits, just submit the current period and you will be caught up. Also, need councils to review their safe environment status audits as we are only at 50% qualified across the state. I appointed directors have not completed their training or background check, GKs or FSs may need to go back into council administration and reappoint positions. Reminder without safe environment qualifications, you could forfeit your council's year end award.

One last thing, please when signing up a new member please input and only use the agent referral code "WMundy" when completing the online application. This helps our dedicated field agent plus it is fewer key strokes than Blessed McGivney. Significant upcoming activities that should be on your radar include:

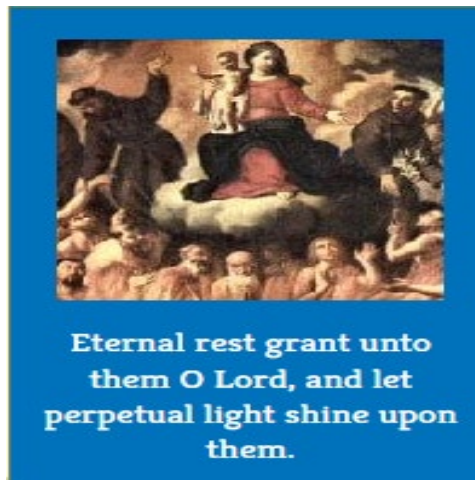

January 22, Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), no. 373, designates January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children":

"In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion."

National Prayer Vigil for Life - January 22-23

The National Prayer Vigil for Life is a prayer vigil held on the eve of the March for Life each January. Thousands of pilgrims from across the nation pray for an end to abortion and a greater respect for all human life. It is held at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C.

The National Prayer Vigil for Life is one small part of the Church's "great prayer for life." It is sponsored by the USCCB Pro-Life Secretariat, the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, and The Catholic University of America Office of Campus Ministry.
