
A Christmas Prayer

State Secretary

I sincerely hope that you had a Blessed Thanksgiving. It is hard to believe that 5 months have gone by, and Christmas and New Years will be here soon. “The momentum continues” in our state where we continue to break records because of your efforts and your commitment to grow the order in your councils and the state. As of Nov 26th, the Utah jurisdiction continues to sit at Number 1 in the order and has qualified for the coveted Supreme Pinnacle Award where we have achieved 120% of membership. Year to date, Utah has brought in 307 new members with 276 [89.9%] of these men transferring into councils to become active members of the order. Another key accomplishment is that **all councils have grown by at least one member** – so all of you are involved in this effort – Thank you.

Council achievements include 14 councils who have already met their membership goal, thus qualifying for the Father McGivney award and 6 of these councils are double star or higher. Additional congratulations go out GK Juan Arriaga and Council 7961 finishing **number 1** and GK Patrick Trimm and Council 18795 placing as number 16 in the Fisher’s of men incentive. Utah leaderboard is provided in below chart - kudos to all! As a reminder, with all the growth that we have been experiencing, please review your online membership rosters, encourage your online prospects to complete the CUF and get them active in your councils. As of Nov 26th, we have 126 men that we can convert to active Utah Knights.

On October 22 and 23, the State membership team conducted a Church Drive at St. Francis Council 5214 in Kearns. Here, the team identified over 75 men who are interested in joining the knights. At midyear, Bill Mundy will present on available weekends for upcoming Church Drives over the next six months. So, start thinking when your council may want a Church Drive as weekends are filling up fast.

Thanks to PSD Bob Masse, Coats for Kids distribution is in full swing. As a reminder, please submit your Coats for Kids pledges or order payments as soon as you can to the State Secretary. If you need an invoice for record keeping send me a note.

Thank you to Membership Director Bill Mundy who is in process of distributing the Christmas buttons to DDs and councils – just in time for Christmas. In addition, Bill asked me to remind all of you to use his agent referral code “**WMundy**” when members complete the online membership application. Also, FSs start thinking about ordering membership cards and invoicing dues for next FY – just around the corner.

A couple of items not get included in last month’s article due to file corruption that I will briefly cover here: We are making significant progress towards instating a new council at St. Anns in Salt Lake City. On Oct 24th & 25th, through the efforts of DD Richard Green, Membership Director Bill Mundy, and the Utah membership team we recruited 10 new men from the parish. On Nov 19th, we held and in person CUF where 6 members were brought into full knighthood. We are anticipating council institution in early 3rd Quarter.

Thanks go out GK Dennis Robles and council 1136 who hosted the States Soccer Challenge on Oct 19th with a significant turn out from the youth. Also, shout out to PSD Chuck Dover who distributed of the state scholarship raffle tickets – if you have not received, please contact your DD or Chuck.

Lastly, the State’s Financial Position Statement and Cash flow are in excellent shape. **All assemblies** and 31 councils have paid their per capita which enables us to support our programs without a financial barrier.

Community

The **Bright Futures** program invites councils to support the students and schools in their communities. Too often, youth face significant barriers to their educational success. Councils can help by providing funding and resources to those most in need.

The **Celebrating Our Catholic Heritage** program encourages councils to celebrate the cultures and traditions of their parish communities. This program aims to educate, inspire, and unite the community while celebrating the deep-rooted faith and cultural heritage of its members.

Faith

The **¡Viva Cristo Rey!** program celebrates the sanctity of the Mexican Martyrs, including members of the Knights of Columbus, who were killed for their faith during the religious persecution of Catholics by the Mexican government in the early 20th century. During the persecution, which led to “La Cristiada,” or the “Cristero War,” priests, missionaries and members of religious orders were expelled from the country, more than a million Mexicans migrated to the United States seeking refuge and others spontaneously organized to defend themselves against government oppression, some peacefully and others taking up arms under the banner of “Cristo Rey y Santa María de Guadalupe” or “Christ the King and Holy Mary of Guadalupe.”

The **Imitating Saint Juan Diego** program encourages councils to promote devotion to St. Juan Diego and Our Lady of Guadalupe. As Knights of Columbus, whose patroness is Our Lady of Guadalupe, we are called to be her messengers, just as St. Juan Diego was throughout his life.

Family

QUINCEAÑERA SUPPORT

A quinceañera is a celebration, common in Hispanic cultures, that marks the passage of a 15-year-old young woman from childhood to adulthood. These celebrations can include Mass or prayer, music, dancing, food and other festivities. Ideally, the celebration should include the young woman and her family thanking God for the life she has lived and asking for His blessing going forward.

The **Remembering Our Faithful Departed** program calls upon councils to honor and pray for the deceased members of their council, families, and parish community. By commemorating the dearly departed, and asking for the intercession of the saints, Knights can help others overcome the grief that accompanies the death of a loved one, strengthen family bonds, promote the unique cultural and religious traditions of their parishes, and help the suffering souls in purgatory.

Life

The **Gospel of Life** program encourages Knights to educate themselves and others on the sanctity of life from conception to natural death. The goal of the program is to equip Catholic men and their parish communities with the knowledge they need to defend human life, especially by studying St. John Paul II's historic encyclical *Evangelium Vitae* (Latin for "Gospel of Life").

The **Holy Hour for Life with Our Lady of Guadalupe** program calls upon councils to organize adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and ask for Our Lady of Guadalupe's intercession for the pro-life cause.

Faith Director

The Church's liturgical season of Christmas is one of its shortest, but also one of its most unique. Within it is the eight-day celebration of the Lord's Nativity — known as the Christmas octave — as well as other feasts pertaining to the manifestation that Jesus is Lord of the nations. And there are feasts of several saints, many of whose stories contain special significance to the season.
